# Residential Stormwater Issues

As rain water flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants. Stormwater can flow into the sewer system or directly to a natural body of water. Water from the storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the water bodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water. By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants off the ground and out of stormwater. Adopt these healthy household habits and help protect lakes, streams, rivers and wetlands.

### **Healthy Household Habits** for Clean Water

#### Home Repair and Improvement

- > Sweep up and properly dispose of construction debris. such as concrete and mortar. > Use hazardous substances like paints, solvents, and cleaners in the smallest amounts possible, and follow the directions on the label. Clean up spills immediately and dispose of the waste safely. Store substances properly to avoid leaks and
- > Purchase and use non-toxic, biodegradable, recycled, and recyclable products whenever possible.
- > Clean paint brushes in a sink, not outdoors. Filter and reuse paint thinner when using oil-based paints. Properly dispose of excess paints

through a household hazardous waste collection program or donate unused paint to local organizations.

> Reduce the amount of paved area and increase the amount of vegetated area in your yard. Use native plants in your landscaping to reduce the need for watering during dry periods. Consider directing downspouts away from paved surfaces onto lawns and other measures to increase infiltration and reduce polluted runoff.

# **Vehicle and Garage**

- > Use a biodegradable car wash to minimize the soapy water flowing into the storm drain and eventually into your local water body.
- > Check your car, boat, motorcycle, and other machinery and equipment for leaks and spills. Make repairs as soon as possible. Clean up spilled fluids with an absorbent material like kitty litter or sand, and don't rinse the spills into a nearby storm drain. Remember to properly dispose of the absorbent material.
- > Recycle used oil and other automotive fluids at participating service stations. Don't dump these chemicals down the storm drain or dispose of them in your trash.

### Lawn and Garden

> Use pesticides and fertilizers sparingly. When use is necessary, use these chemicals in the recommended amounts. Avoid application if the forecast calls for rain; otherwise, chemicals will be washed into your local stream

- or pond.
- > Select native plants and grasses that are drought and pest resistant. Native plants require less water, fertilizer, and pesticides.
- > Sweep up yard debris, rather than hosing down areas. Compost or recycle yard waste when possible.
- > Don't over water your lawn. Water during the cool times of the day and don't let water run off into the storm drain.
- > Cover piles of dirt and mulch being used in landscaping projects to prevent these pollutants from blowing or washing off your yard and into local water bodies. Vegetate bare spots in your yard to prevent soil erosion.

#### **Pet Care**

> When walking your pet, remember to pick up the waste and dispose of it properly. Leaving pet waste on the ground increases public health risks by allowing harmful bacteria and nutrients to wash into the storm drain and eventually into local water bodies.

# **Swimming Pool and Spa**

>Drain your swimming pool only when a test kit does not detect chlorine levels. Properly store pool and spa chemicals to prevent leaks and spills, preferably in a covered area to avoid exposure to stormwater.

# Remember:

Storm drains connect to water bodies! Only rain down the drain!

# **WATERING BAN REMINDER**

The Village watering ban goes into effect on May 15th through October 1st, between the hours of 11:00 am to 5:00 pm. The ban affects outside water use, including (but not limited to); sprinkling lawns/shrubs; washing vehicles; filling pools; and recreational use of garden hoses. The watering ban complies with State required water conservation practices. Violators may receive a citation.

#### PEDESTRIAN CROSSING SIGNALS

There has been a lot of road construction in Hoffman Estates over the past five years. Along with the roads being redone, many of our traffic signals have been updated.

When you approach an intersection and want to walk across, you must press the push button, or you might not have enough time to cross. To alleviate congestion, the crossing times have been shortened, unless a pedestrian is present. After you press the button, the white WALK / WALKING PERSON will light up. It is now safe to look both ways and proceed across the street. If you see the flashing orange DON'T WALK / HAND and you have already started to cross, you will have enough time to make it across. However, if you see the flashing orange DON'T WALK / HAND, and you have not started to cross, wait at the corner because you will not have



enough time to cross. Remember to never cross if you see a solid orange DON'T WALK / HAND. If you have any questions, call the Transportation Division at (847) 781-2655.

# HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION EVENT—MAY 14, 2005

The Illinois EPA and the Village of Schaumburg will be co-sponsoring a household hazardous waste collection day on Saturday, May 14, 2005, at Schaumburg High School, 1100 W. Schaumburg Road. The collection gives citizens the opportunity to safely dispose of oil based paints, thinners, chemical cleaners, antifreeze, motor oil, weed killers, insecticides, pesticides and similar household products. Fluorescent and other high intensity discharge lamps, mercury and other mercury containing products, such as thermometers and old thermostats, may also be brought to the collection. Latex paint is not to be brought to the collection site. Collection day hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. For more information, residents may call the EPA at

# MERCURY THERMOMETER EXCHANGE PROGRAM

The Village of Hoffman Estates, in partnership with the Solid Waste Agency of Northern Cook County, is collecting all mercury-based thermometers (used to take human temperature readings). Simply bring your old mercury thermometers to the Village Hall during business hours and receive a brand new, non-mercury thermometer in exchange.

Please do not throw away household items containing mercury as these items can contaminate our landfills. Additional household items containing mercury, such as thermostats and blood pressure cuffs, may also be brought to the Village Hall for disposal. There is no exchange program for these additional mercury-based items, however, the disposal program is free to Hoffman Estates residents. #### HELP PREVENT SANITARY SEWER BACK-UPS

Property damage by sanitary sewer back-ups can be costly. Fortunately, there are some precautions that can be taken to minimize the possibility of a sanitary sewer back-up into your home.

Back-ups usually occur when materials or products are introduced into the sewer system that should be disposed of in another manner. Please follow the product manufacturer's suggestions for disposal of those items. Your assistance will help to prevent back-ups that may affect you and your neighbors.

If you are experiencing a problem with your sewer service line, please contact the Public Works Department at 847-490-6800. A service representative will be dispatched to check the Village's main line sewer system. If the main line is clear, you will be advised to contact a plumber.



Materials that can cause blockages within an individual sanitary sewer service line or the Village's main line sewer system include:

- Cooking grease
- Garbage disposal by-products
- Feminine hygiene products
- Disposable diapers
- Other paper products

# FREE BIKE HELMETS

The Police Department offers free bike helmets to families who cannot afford to purchase them. Anyone interested in obtaining helmets should contact the community relations unit at (847) 781-2830 to make arrangements. Many sizes are available, but quantities are limited. Also, just a reminder, all bicycles should be registered with the Police Department. This service is also free.

# HIDE IT, LOCK IT, OR LOSE IT

Although the Police Department does everything it can to reduce the incidence of burglary to vehicles, the Police can't be everywhere all the time. We need to make sure we lock our vehicles and keep valuables out of sight. By doing so, you will decrease the chance of becoming a victim of a burglary to a vehicle. Our citizens are always encouraged to call the Police anytime they see a suspicious person or activity. By working together, we can continue to reduce crime in our community.
