PURPOSE: To receive a continuous revenue stream for participation in Enel X

Inc. program of Emergency Demand Response by managing

curtailable electrical capacity at three (3) Village facilities.

BACKGROUND: The Village has been participating in a voluntary Emergency

Demand Response with Enel X (formerly EnerNoc) since 2011. After some early contract adjustments, the Village established the Village Hall, Police, and Sears Centre Arena facilities to be the main

participating buildings in the program.

Although we have never been activated for an actual demand response event, we have enjoyed a steady revenue stream from being available to shed electrical load off of the ComEd grid should it be necessary to do so. Our revenues averaged approximately \$20,000 to \$25,000 per year until 2017 when the Sears Centre Arena Generac generator had to be removed from the program. This was due to changes in the EPA's emissions standards on generators used for demand response purposes.

As a result, Public Works requested Board approval for the installation of an underutilized 900 kW mobile generator at the Sears Centre Arena which would meet the EPA Tier 2 emissions requirements, allow the arena to once again be allowed back into the Emergency Demand Response program, and once again generate additional revenues for the Village.

DISCUSSION:

When the arena generator installation project was completed, a number of positive developments had taken place. Enel X verified proof of Tier 2 status and is currently processing all the necessary EPA permitting. Capacity prices have increased and, with our previous 3 year agreement up for renewal (last one was renewed in 2017), Enel X is raising our split from 38% to 58%. This is due to our past excellent performance and the state of the market. The program now runs year round, with a summer and a winter component further enhancing revenues.

In the new proposed service agreement, should an emergency event occur, such as a heat or cold wave, Enel X will provide a one-half (1/2) hour notification to the Village to implement the predetermined energy reduction target at the 3 facilities. There is no performance penalty for a failure to meet, or implement the targeted reduction during the response event. However, our earnings would be reduced.

Event duration would typically be 4 hours between the hours of 10:00 am and 10:00 pm during peak events. There have been no events called in the ComEd zone since participating in the Enel X Emergency Demand Response program back in 2011.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Based on the combined estimated capacity of 899 kW for the Sears Centre Arena, the Police Station, and the Village Hall, total base revenue for the 2020-2022 period is estimated to be \$72,975 (see Enel X Emergency Demand Response Estimate). Since the capacity rates have not been published yet for the 2023 season, they have not been included in this projection. If the rates stay the same however, we can anticipate the total base revenue over the term of this agreement to be approximately \$110,462.00.

This does not include any additional revenue from energy payments during an event. This is an annual program that would provide continuous revenues to the Village and will make a significant contribution to our overall energy reduction strategy.

PURPOSE:

To award a contract for 2020 Parkway Tree Planting

Program.

BACKGROUND:

This is an annual budgeted program whereby the Village purchases and plants parkway trees for a) subdivisions based on deposits collected from building permits, b) replacement tree plantings from accidents and storm damage, and for c) parkway tree plantings utilized to increase aesthetic value for various Village projects. Specifications were prepared and mailed requesting bids from contractors for the performance of this work and included options for extension of the contract for the respective 2021 and 2022 seasons. Planting of these trees occurs in fall with select species planted in the spring based on nursery recommendations for best chance of survivability.

DISCUSSION:

On January 30, 2020 three (3) bids were opened and staff began an evaluation process. After reviewing the bids received it was determined that the St. Aubin Nursery had submitted the lowest bid.

St. Aubin Nursery is known to the Village of Hoffman Estates for parkway tree planting services. St Aubin Nursery planted a total of 2,500+ quality trees in conjunction with a number of village programs, including the Emerald Ash

DISCUSSION: (continued)

Borer replacement program. The availability and quality of installation of product has for the most part exceeded expectations by the village. The village has utilized St. Aubin Nursery for tree planting programs over the last 25+ years.

A comparison/tabulation of the three (3) bid proposals is attached.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Village reserves the right to change, add or delete quantities of trees to be planted. This quantity is conditioned upon the total amount of funds budgeted for the program each fiscal year as well as the rate of completion of homes in subdivisions and was indicated in the bid specifications.

Given our ability to control the quantity of trees the contractor will be planting, staff can cause the contract sum to be equal to that of funding availability. Based on specifications requirements, bidders submitted prices per tree to be planted by specie as indicated on the attached tabulation form.

Funding for this year's program is supported by \$59,750 budgeted within the Street Division Forestry & Grounds Program; Accident, storm damage, and out of warranty replacement plantings (\$35,000), planting/replanting of Village rights-of-way (\$11,750), Arbor Day & beautification plantings (\$3,000), and Beatification plantings (\$1,500) as well as (\$10,000) slated for village hall landscape improvements. Separate escrow account funding for subdivision plantings (\$40,250) is also included. This will permit approximately 330 trees to be planted in conjunction with these various programs for the 2020 season.

RECOMMENDATION:

Request authorization to award contract for 2020 Parkway Tree Planting Program to St. Aubin Nursery of Kirkland, IL (low bid) in an amount not to exceed \$100,000.

PURPOSE:

To maintain proper visibility and safety for vehicular and pedestrian traffic, to promote health and vitality for disease resistance and attack from destructive insect pests, to regulate and encourage proper growth, reduce wind and snow/ice damage and to improve aesthetic characteristics to the overall tree canopy.

BACKGROUND:

On January 22, 2020 the Village advertised for bids and sent bid documents to eight (8) vendors. These bids also sought options for 2nd and 3rd year contract extensions which saves staff time and allows vendors to bid on the potential of three years of tree work.

On February 5, 2020 five (5) bids were opened and staff began an evaluation process. After reviewing the bids it was determined that Advanced Tree Care, Lincolnshire, IL was the lowest responsible bidder. Advanced Tree care has performed tree trimming services for a number of municipalities including Schiller Park, Deerfield, Northbrook, and Highland Park. References were contacted and very positive feedback regarding the company's performance was received from all contacted. A comparison/tabulation of the five (5) bid proposals is attached.

DISCUSSION:

The 2020 budget includes funding for the use of (annual) contractor assisted tree trimming to augment the current in-house tree trimming program. This ongoing annual tree trimming program permits needed maintenance to occur on regularly scheduled intervals. It enables the timely removal of existing and potential hazardous conditions. In addition, the vendor work permits increased time and the ability for Village team members to address residents' requests for service.

It has been frequently noted that areas receiving scheduled recurring trimming, experience a dramatic decrease in resident requested in-house trimming operations as well as damage from wind and storms.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

In 2020, a total of \$50,000 has been budgeted for contractor assisted tree trimming. The low qualifying bid received was in the amount of \$54,200 based on an *estimated quantity* of trees to be trimmed. This quantity was for the purpose of comparing bids only. The Village reserved the right to change, add or delete quantities of trees to be trimmed as it deems necessary. This was indicated in the bid specifications. Based on these specification requirements bidders submitted prices per tree to be trimmed by tree size class as indicated on the attached tabulation of bids form.

Given our ability to control the quantity of trees the contractor will trim, staff can cause the contract sum to be equal to that of the annual funding allocation.

The specifications mailed requesting bids from contractors for the performance of this work included an option, solely for the Village's future consideration, for extension of the contract for the respective 2021 and 2022 seasons. The value of potential contract extension, based upon vendor contract performance during the current season has been proven. The better care the successful contractor provides for the sites this year, in order that he attains VOHE's contract extension for the next season, the better the cumulative effect that this improved care level has upon VOHE properties.

RECOMMENDATION:

Request authorization to award contract for 2020 Contracted Parkway Tree Trimming Program to Advanced Tree Care, Lincolnshire, IL (low bid) in an amount not to exceed \$50,000.

BACKGROUND: This is an annually budgeted program where the department

provides a spring and fall brush pickup service to the residents of the village. The program is addressed through a combination of in-house staff as well as contractual assistance. This additional assistance has proven very beneficial to offsetting the need for additional public works staff from other divisions. This keeps department staff available to address regularly assigned duties or emergencies

that may occur.

DISCUSSION: On January 29, 2020 five (5) bids were opened and staff

began an evaluation process. After reviewing the bids it was determined that Lucas Landscape and Design, had submitted the lowest bid. Lucas Landscape and Design has provided storm damage clean up services utilizing grapple loaders for the Villages of Glenview, Wilmette and the City of Highland Park. All references were contacted and provided very positive feedback regarding the company's performance.

A comparison/tabulation of the five (5) bid proposals is

attached.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Village reserved the right to change, add or delete quantities of hours to be utilized. This quantity is conditioned upon the total amount of funds budgeted for the program each fiscal year as well as the amount of material that is set out for pick up.

Given our ability to control the quantity of hours the contractor will be utilized, staff can cause the contract sum to be equal to the available funding. Based on specification requirements, bidders submitted prices per hour for requested services as indicated on the attached tabulation form.

Funding for this year's program is supported by \$40,000, budgeted within the Street Division Forestry & Grounds Program. This represents an increase in funding for 2020 of \$10,000 that will be utilized to help offset some of the departmental burden for the spring season and allow favorable focus to be given to many of the programs that are performed throughout the spring.

BACKGROUND: The approved 2020 budget included the replacement of the current

Transportation and Engineering vehicle E98 (2008 Ford Escape

Hybrid) at a cost of \$30,000.

DISCUSSION: Current Unit E98 is a 2008 Ford Escape Hybrid with approximately

99,000 miles. The requested replacement vehicle is a 2020 Ford Escape SE FHEV (Hybrid). The cost of the new vehicle is \$27,676 with an additional \$2,000 required to install a light bar and strobe lights for safety. PURPOSE:

To update and relocate the entrance sign at the Village Hall, 1900 Hassell Road, with an electronic message board to be located at the northwest corner of the entrance. In addition to replacing the entrance sign, add a new low profile monument sign to the entrance island.

BACKGROUND:

The current entrance sign at the Village Hall is in poor condition, and not in a good location to identify the property as the Village Hall.

DISCUSSION:

As a result of efforts to update the aged and antiquated entryway sign, two separate sign contractors were asked to submit design proposals for the entrance to the Village Hall. The proposals were to include design options for a Watchfire electronic message board that was compatible with other Village signs, installed at the northwest corner of the entrance to the Village Hall, and a matching low profile monument sign to be installed in the center island at the entrance to the Village Hall parking lot. Quantum Sign Corp of Sugar Grove, IL, who recently worked with Kevin Kramer and Economic Development, submitted several favorable design options.

A concern that rose was the potential for light pollution to affect the residents in the townhouses on Hassell near the entrance to the Village Hall. It is hoped the impact will be negligible with the placement of the sign focused on the intersection of Hassell and

Huntington, rather than directly facing the buildings. The ability to dim the message board in the evenings as needed should also reduce the impact.


FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Quantum Sign Corp quoted a price of \$36,846 for the fabrication and installation of a single-faced monument sign with electronic message board, to be located at the northwest corner of the entrance to the Village Hall. Quantum Sign Corp also quoted a price of \$15,884 for the fabrication and installation of a double-faced monument sign in the center island of the entrance to the Village Hall. The total quote for the both signs from Quantum Signs is \$52,730. There was \$125,000 approved in the 2019 Mid-year financial review which remains available for replacement of the existing sign.


Village Hall Sign Replacement DESIGN SELECTION

Existing Sign





The current proposal is for two new Village Hall signs: one singlesided message board near the site of the existing sign and one monument sign in the center-island.









MAJOR PROJECT STATUS

Well 9 Abandonment

On August 19, 2019 Village Board authorized the contract with Water Well Solutions for the work to proper abandon Well 9. Pre-Construction Meeting was held shortly. Permit application has been submitted to Cook County Public Health Department (PHD). The plan for well abandonment was revised per County instruction and was resubmitted to the County PHD. The work started in the week of September 23. By the end of September the well pump and column piping has been all removed. By the end of October the project is complete for all work on Well 9 abandonment. Everything is satisfactory to the County Department of Public Health. The completed well sealing forms were submitted to IEPA. Final invoice, including Change Order, has been approved. In January 2020, with limited contractor assistance, the following work is all complete, which includes:

- 1. Demolition of structure down to top of slab-
- 2. Removal of concrete footings and foundations
- 3. Site asphalt removals throughout the lot
- 4. Removal of water main and sewer service pipes

The remaining work is removal of water main connection and the tap/Tee, which is planned in coordination of the street reconstruction project. In addition, with assistance from the contractor, the deficiency of the overfilled concrete and casing pipe will be removed.

Water Distribution Systems Study

On April 1, 2019 Village Board authorized the contract with Burns & McDonnell for engineering services to study & evaluate the Village's water distribution systems for infrastructure capital project planning. Project Kick-Off Meeting was held on May 14, 2019. Due to the long time needed for massive amount data collection and processing on Village's water distribution system, field work did not start until September. Work completed in September includes loading Historian program into the SCADA system for comprehensive analysis of water system operation and Laying out field work for fire flow testing and telog installation. Hydraulic model for the water system is being created. Work completed in October includes:

field measurements (fire flows & pressures) and field data insertion into the model, model calibration. Work completed in November includes tower evaluation as well as running scenarios to confirm model results in comparison to SCADA system data. Work completed in January includes:

Completion of system analysis with brief summary of results.

Completion of preliminary Aster Lane tower and station evaluation and overall storage analysis.

Work planned for February:

- 1. Work session on model for hydraulic analysis and storage analysis (2/25) to review analysis results and project usage
- 2. Complete system improvement analysis and initiate develop capital improvement plan.
- 3. Initiate the Water Main Replacement Task.

MWRD IICP Engineering

On July 2, 2018 the Village Board approved a contract with Baxter & Woodman Consulting Engineers for engineering and field services required for compliance with MWRD' Infiltration/Inflow Control Program (IICP). The services will cover the following areas:

- 1. Conduct a prioritized condition assessment of high risk public sanitary sewer system infrastructure through various inspection and testing methods.
- 2. Begin rehabilitation of major defects within three years of identification.
- 3. Utilize inspections to catalog illegal connections in high risk areas for disconnection in Private Sector Program (PSP).
- 4. Develop and implement a Private Sector Program (PSP).
- 5. Develop and submit annual reports under the Short Term Requirements and Long Term Operation and Maintenance Program (LTOMP)


Project Kick off meeting was held on August 8, 2018 with planning of the immediate task of smoke testing of all sanitary sewer in high risk areas, which was completed in October, 2018 and covered all High Risk Areas (12 sub-basins with a total of 133,133 feet of sewer mains) per MWRD standards. Review of the final report is completed and 4 areas have been identified for dye water testing to further determine point of source of infiltration and inflow into the sanitary sewer system. The actual work of dye water testing was completed in June. Camera inspection of remaining 173 manholes inspection is in May 2019. A list of critical sewer repairs has been selected for IICP compliance in 2019 and 2020. Design engineering and preparation of bid documents was completed in September 2019. The project was bid out successfully and contract was awarded to the low responsible bidder, Michels Pipe Services. Construction contract was executed. Preconstruction meeting was held on December 12, 2019. Work planning is all complete. Sewer cleaning and inspection is all complete in January 2020 and sewer rehab by cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) lining is scheduled for late February and March 2020. Staff already responded to comments by MWRD on the Village's Private Sector Program (PSP) and the Long Term Operation and Maintenance Program (LTOMP). Staff consider both PSP and LTOMP accepted.




