The Village maintains 18,000 public trees. If you stacked them on top of each other they would be 120 miles tall. It's only 60 miles to outer space!



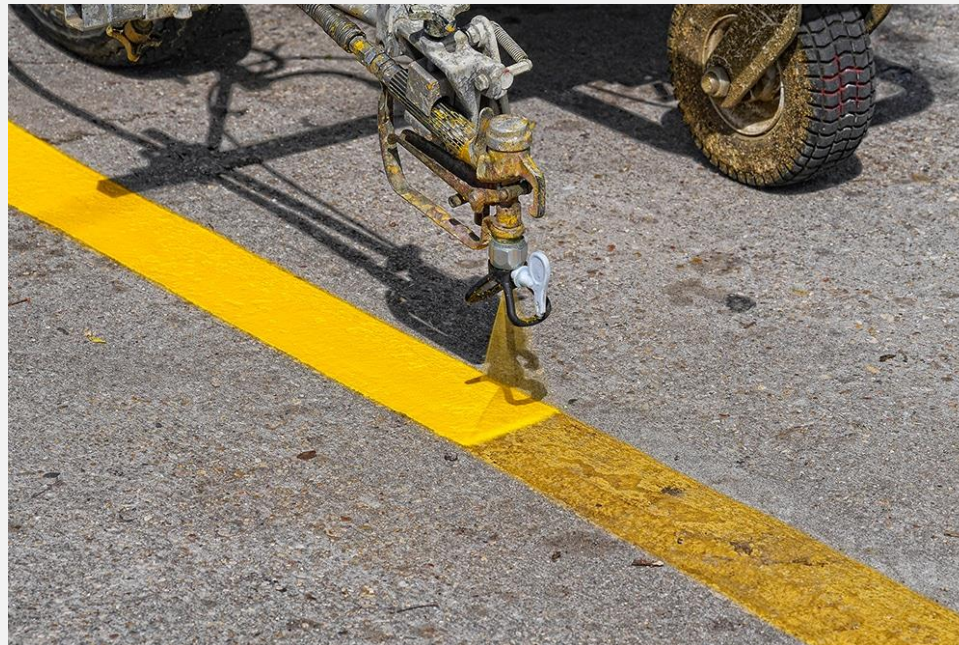

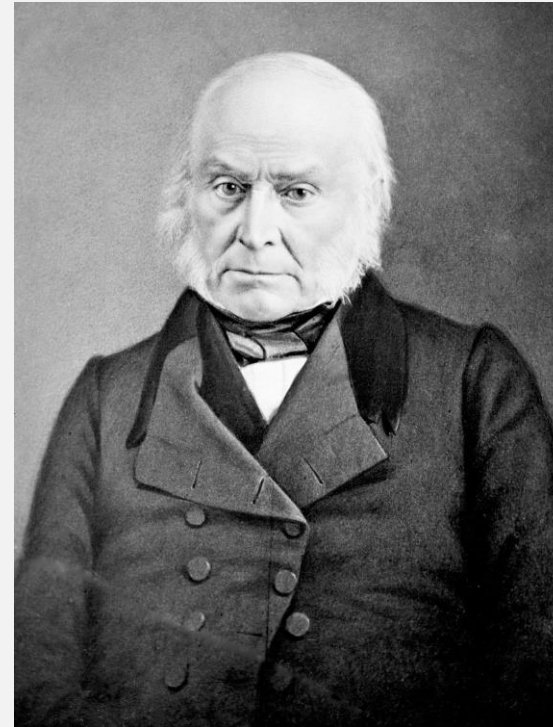
