### **PLAN PURPOSE**

### **Taxi Discount Program**

Program registration is ongoing with identification cards and coupons sent to residents. Since its inception, a total of 773 residents have registered for the program, with 323 current eligible registrants. The graph below shows historical, year-to-date use, and an estimate of the 2022 usage. The most recent coupons turned in covered through mid-April.
