PURPOSE: To request authorization to award a five (5) year contract for the Village's

body worn camera program and in-car camera system to Axon Enterprise

Inc., Scottsdale, Arizona in an amount not to exceed \$940,613.31.

BACKGROUND: The Village of Hoffman Estates is seeking a comprehensive Police Body-

Worn Camera (BWC) Solution to continue to create transparency in public safety and ensure state mandate compliance. The Hoffman Estates Police Department has made the Body-Worn Camera initiative a key priority of the police department's community-oriented policing program. In February of 2021, Illinois Governor Pritzker signed the "SAFE-T Act" which mandates the use of officer-worn body cameras for a municipality of our size by January 1, 2024. This, along with anticipated supply chain issues has expedited the urgency of the BWC Program. The integrated solution will provide BWC hardware and accessories, a Digital Evidence

Management System (DEMS), and in-car camera systems for squad cars.

DISCUSSION: A comprehensive search was done to find a body worn camera that fit the needs of our department and was the most reliable and user friendly for our

officers. We utilized a third party procurement solution company, Market Place City, to assist us in the request for proposal (RFP) process as well as analyzing data and quote comparisons. Initially twenty-five (25) body worn camera vendors were analyzed as to the product and software that they offered. Out of these, seven (7) vendors were identified as being able to provide the basic requirements that we recognize as crucial to our BWC Program needs and were invited to submit a proposal. Out of those seven (7), four (4) vendors provided quotes in response to the RFP. Two of these vendors (Brite and Utility Associates) lacked technology, software, and features that we felt were essential to the program. The other two vendors (Axon and Motorola) were reputable companies that offered comparable

products.

During this process, it also became evident that for the BWC to work seamlessly, it would require replacing our existing Panasonic Arbitrator incar cameras with the in-car cameras of the vendor that we choose. For this reason, the RFP included a bundle option which included the BWC (quantity 100), in-car cameras (quantity 28), equipment and docking stations, and all necessary software and unlimited cloud based storage.

Motorola

Motorola offers the Watch Guard V300 as their current body worn camera and the M500 as their in-car camera. The Digital Evidence Platform (DEM) utilized by Motorola is Command Central. A customizable two-minute prerecording buffer is an option available to the BWC. The Motorola package includes redaction software. Motorola offers pricing as a one-time purchase, or over a five (5) year period.

Axon

Axon offers the Axon Body 3 as their current BWC and the Axon Fleet 3 as their in-car camera. The Digital Evidence Platform (DEM) utilized by Axon is Evidence.com. A customizable two-minute prerecording buffer is an option available to the BWC. The Axon package includes redaction software. Axon offers pricing as a one-time purchase, or over a five (5) year period.

Although Axon and Motorola offered similar programs, there were distinct differences that made Axon outrival other competitors.

Body Worn Cameras

The Motorola BWC reports that it has a 12-hour battery life. However, after speaking with local police departments that are currently utilizing the Motorola Watch Guard V300, we learned that those cameras can only get an average of eight (8) hours out of the battery life. In order to combat this problem users have lowered their camera resolution from 1080p to 720p. The Motorola representative agreed that the battery life in real world circumstances can usually only get ten (10) hours of battery life if many or all the features are turned off. This will not accommodate our officers who work a twelve (12) hour shift. The other information obtained from outside agencies utilizing the Motorola BWC is that they have had a problem with the batteries "bulging" from what they believe is overheating while in the charging cradle. Motorola has not been able to provide a cause or solution to this problem. Finally, other police departments reported complaints regarding the mounts available to secure the BWC to an officer's shirt or jacket. One police department stated that they had to go to a third party and purchase new mounts because the mounts that Motorola offered continuously fell off the officer's uniforms.

In comparison, the Axon BWC is reported to have a battery life of twelve (12) hours. The police agencies that are currently using the Axon BWC report that this is accurate. There were no complaints about battery life or the camera itself. The Axon camera was reported to be easy to use and "cop

proof."

In-car Cameras

Motorola utilizes the M500 in-car camera. For the BWC to integrate with the in-car camera, there are additional programs that would need to run on the Mobile Data Terminal (MDT)¹ which is already tasked with multiple programs which cause the MDT to run slower then intended. Motorola also offers an automated license plate reader, although they do not offer the subscriptions to the services associated with license plate readers. This subscription is an added annual cost of \$13,000. Motorola will not remove our current in-car cameras or install their cameras. This would require us to use Ultra Strobe to accommodate the installation. Ultra Strobe quoted us \$19,000 to remove and install the in-car cameras.

Axon utilizes the Axon Fleet 3 in-car camera. Both the BWC and in-car camera are tied to a hub in the trunk of the car which allows the footage of the BWC to integrate with the in-car camera using the MDT as a monitor without additional programs that would need to be running on the system. Included in their quote is the removal of the Panasonic Arbitrator in-car cameras in a condition to resell along with the installation of the Axon cameras.

Software/Storage

Both Axon and Motorola offer unlimited cloud storage. Motorola recommends additional equipment and services being added to our current infrastructure for compatibility which was not included in their pricing where Axon expresses that they can work within our current infrastructure.

Motorola utilizes Command Central as the web-based software to store and utilize the camera footage and evidence. Command Central does not integrate with the Third District Cook County Court and camera footage required for court cases would require utilizing manhours to pull data off the system and copy it onto a disk and transfer it to court.

Axon utilizes Evidence.com which is the system currently compatible with the Third District Cook County Court. This allows digital evidence and videos to be transmitted to an Assistant State's Attorney directly through email significantly cutting down on manhours. The advanced capabilities of Axon's redaction software create efficiencies which ultimately has the capability of reducing staff hours.

If approved, Axon can start implementation of the body worn camera program to include set up and training October 2022. The in-car cameras

would not be available for twelve (12) months due to supply chain issues. Payment for the in-car cameras would not be made until they are implemented.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Axon provides the option to pay for the body worn cameras outright at \$608,645.03 and the in-car cameras at \$331,968.28 for a total of \$940,613.31. They provide a second option of splitting the payments over five (5) years at \$121,729.01 annually for the body worn cameras, and \$66,393.65 annually for the in-car cameras for a total annual amount of \$188,122.66. Axon cameras are covered by a total coverage warranty and Axon provides an automatic refresh of new body worn cameras after 2.5 years at no additional cost.

In comparison, the total cost of the Motorola product is approximately \$738,000. This includes the additional installation costs as well as the automatic license plate reader functionality.

CONCLUSION:

Staff has spent considerable time researching and evaluating the various body camera products. This includes assistance from a third party procurement advisor, testing the equipment first hand as well as speaking to other law enforcement agencies that use both the Axon and Motorola products. Axon has developed into the market leader for body worn cameras and that has been confirmed by our analysis. While the cost of Axon is higher than that of its competitors, the reliability and performance (both in the hardware as well as the software) is significantly better than other companies. It is important that we have a dependable product that will work on a consistent basis. As such, Staff is recommending the purchase of the Axon products. Additionally, this item was reviewed and recommended by the Emerging Technologies Commission.

RECOMMENDATION:

To request authorization to award a five (5) year contract for the Village's Body Worn Camera Program and in-car camera system to Axon Enterprise Inc., Scottsdale, Arizona in an amount not to exceed \$940,613.31.

BUSINESS CHALLENGE

The Village of Hoffman Estates is seeking a comprehensive Police Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Solution to continue to create transparency in public safety and ensure state mandate compliance. The integrated solution should provide BWC hardware and accessories, a Digital Evidence Management System (DEMS), data storage, and in-squad car camera systems.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Chief of Police Kasia Cawley has made the Body-Worn Camera initiative a key priority of the police department's community-oriented policing program. In February of 2021, Illinois Governor Pritzker signed the "SAFE-T Act" which mandates the use of officer-worn body cameras for an agency this size by January 1, 2024. This, and current supply chain issues, has expedited the urgency of the BWC Program.

Process Overview (1/2)



The Village of Hoffman Estates is seeking a comprehensive Police Body-Worn Camera (BWC) Solution to continue to create transparency in public safety and ensure state mandate compliance. The integrated solution should provide BWC hardware and accessories, a Digital Evidence Management System (DEMS), and in-squad car camera systems.

Chronological project sequence:

- The Village of Hoffman Estates contracted with Marketplace.city to assist in the Request for Proposal (RFP) process and to assist in seeking out a comprehensive review of the BWC system and in-car camera system available that would best fit our police department needs.
- More than 25 BWC vendors were identified as being able to provide basic BWC and in-car camera equipment and services.
- Out of the 25 BWC vendors, Seven (7) were identified as being able to fulfill the needs of HEPD and were invited to submit a proposal.
 - Distributed on 6/6/22 and closed 6/22/22
- There were four (4) responses completed by the deadline.
 - Motorola
 - Axon
 - Brite
 - Utility Associates

Process Overview (2/2)



Chronological project sequence:

- After reviewing the data, Hoffman Estates stakeholders requested follow-up meetings with Axon & Motorola to gain further clarity on Information Technology and systems integrations questions. These meetings occurred on 7/20/22.
- Project stakeholders scored the 4 proposals.
- Brite and Utility Associates lacked technology, software, and features that we identified as essential to the program and were removed from consideration.
- On site visits and demos were conducted with agencies currently utilizing Motorola and Axon Implemented over 12 months ago.
 - Agencies reported that Motorola's implementation process did not go efficiently, and continuing issues have been difficult to resolve.
 - Motorola advertises a 12-hour battery life agencies reported that this is not accurate and the most battery life that can be
 obtained is 8 hours if the camera resolution is decreased from 1080p to 720p. This is requiring these agencies to issue two (2)
 batteries per officer. Axon is reported by both the vendor and current agencies as sustaining a 12-hour battery life.
 - Reports of Motorola BWC batteries "bulging" and cameras falling off the camera mounts.
 - Motorola utilized Command Central for evidence management (DEM) which does not integrate with Cook County.
 - The Motorola interface does not auto tag videos which significantly increases the manpower needed for BWC management.
 - No complaints from any agency regarding Axon equipment or management.

Axon chosen as recommended solution by project stakeholders.

Summary & Recommendation



SUMMARY

The Village of Hoffman Estates is recommending Axon Enterprise as their Body-Worn Camera vendor for this project. This recommendation for the most responsible proposal will ensure Hoffman Estates police officers will be well-supported in the field for years to come.

DECISION FACTORS

- Ease-of-use: Intuitive design and interface makes the Axon Body 3 camera stand out amongst competitors. Beyond their operation, the cameras themselves were significantly less cumbersome for officers in comparison to others tested. Other municipalities describe bulging battery packs on other cameras hampering officer maneuverability.
- **Battery Life:** The Axon Body 3 can complete a full officer shift between charges, even at higher resolution and recording durations. HEPD leadership does not have similar confidence that other cameras can last 12 hours with advanced functionality.
- Evidence Management Suite: The Axon solution includes Evidence.com licenses, redaction assistance software, and auto-tagging capabilities. This superior suite of software will provide greater efficiency in handling and transmitting evidence to stakeholders.
- Integration with Squad Car Dashboard Cameras: Seamless integration with the 28 new Fleet 3 dashboard cameras provides a complete picture of the situation in the field. Axon will install the Squad Car cameras themselves without requiring a third-party.





Master Services and Purchasing Agreement for Agency

This Master Services and Purchasing Agreement ("Agreement") is between Axon Enterprise, Inc., a Delaware corporation ("Axon"), and the Village of Hoffman Estates, Illinois ("Agency") This Agreement is effective on the date of the last signature to this Agreement. ("Effective Date"). Axon and Agency are each a "Party" and collectively "Parties". This Agreement governs Agency's purchase and use of the Axon Devices and Services detailed in the Quote Appendix ("Quote") It is the intent of the Parties that this Agreement act as a master agreement governing all subsequent purchases by Agency for the same Axon Devices and Services in the Quote, and all such subsequent quotes accepted by Agency shall be also incorporated into this Agreement by reference as a Quote. The Parties agree as follows:

Definitions.

- 1.1. "Axon Cloud Services" means Axon's web services for Axon Evidence, Axon Records, Axon Dispatch, and interactions between Axon Evidence and Axon Devices or Axon client software. Axon Cloud Service excludes third-party applications, hardware warranties, and my.evidence.com.
- 1.2. "Axon Device" means all hardware provided by Axon under this Agreement.
- 1.3. "Quote" means the documents contained in the Quote Appendix attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. The parties acknowledge that for the purposes of this Agreement there are two Quotes, one for police-worn body cameras and associated software, warranties and professional services, and one for dashboard-mounted cameras and associated software, warranties, and professional services. For the purposes of calculating invoice dates and subscription terms, the two quotes shall be considered separate. Changes in the deployment estimated ship date may change charges in the Quote. Any change in charges must be agreed to in writing by Agency before shipment. Shipping dates are estimates only. Axon is not responsible for typographical errors in any offer by Axon, and Axon reserves the right to cancel any orders resulting from such errors.
- 1.4. "Services" means all services provided by Axon under this Agreement, including software, Axon Cloud Services, and professional services.
- 2. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement begins on the Effective Date and continues until all subscriptions hereunder have expired or have been terminated ("Term").
 - 2.1. All subscriptions including Axon Evidence, Axon Fleet, Officer Safety Plans, Technology Assurance Plans, and TASER 7 plans begin on the date of implementation of each subscription, as stated in the quote.. Each subscription term shall end after 60 months ("Subscription Term").
- 3. <u>Payment</u>. Axon shall invoice upon shipment and annually, on the anniversary date of shipment, thereafter. All payments made by Agency shall comply with the Illinois Local Government Prompt Payment Act 50 ILCS 505/.
- 4. <u>Ownership of Axon Devices.</u> Upon payment by Agency of the total price of each Axon Device and associated accessories as outlined in the Quote, said Axon Devices and associated accessories shall be the property of Agency and Agency shall enjoy all rights and responsibilities associated with said ownership.
- 5. **Shipping**. Axon may make partial shipments and ship Axon Devices from multiple locations. All shipments are EXW (Incoterms 2020) via common carrier. Title and risk of loss pass to Agency upon Axon's delivery to the common carrier. Agency is responsible for any shipping charges in the Quote.
- 6. <u>Returns</u>. All sales are final. Axon does not allow refunds or exchanges, except warranty returns or as provided by state or federal law.

7. Warranty.

- 7.1. Limited Warranty; Disclaimer. Axon warrants that Axon-manufactured Devices are free from defects in workmanship and materials for 1 year from the date of Agency's receipt, except Signal Sidearm and Axon-manufactured accessories, which Axon warrants for 30 months and 90 days, respectively, from the date of Agency's receipt. Used conducted energy weapon ("CEW") cartridges are deemed to have operated properly. Extended warranties run from the expiration of the 1-year hardware warranty through the extended warranty term. All software and Axon Cloud Services, are provided "AS IS," without any warranty of any kind, either express or implied, including without limitation the implied warranties of merchantability, fitness for a particular purpose and non-infringement. Axon Devices, software, and services that are not manufactured, published or performed by Axon ("Third-Party Products") are not covered by Axon's warranty and are only subject to the warranties of the third-party provider or manufacturer.
- 7.2. Claims. If Axon receives a valid warranty claim for an Axon-manufactured Device during the warranty term, Axon's sole responsibility is to repair or replace the Axon-manufactured Device with the same or like Axon-manufactured Device, at Axon's option. A replacement Axon-manufactured Device will be new or like new.

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Axon will warrant the replacement Axon-manufactured Device for the longer of (a) the remaining warranty of the original Axon Manufactured Device or (b) 90-days from the date of repair or replacement.

- 7.2.1. If Agency exchanges a device or part, the replacement item becomes Agency's property, and the replaced item becomes Axon's property. Before delivering an Axon-manufactured Device for service, Agency must upload Axon-manufactured Device data to Axon Evidence or download it and retain a copy. Axon is not responsible for any loss of software, data, or other information contained in storage media or any part of the Axon-manufactured Device sent to Axon for service.
- 7.3. Spare Axon Devices. At Axon's reasonable discretion, Axon may provide Agency a predetermined number of spare Axon Devices as detailed in the Quote ("Spare Axon Devices"). Spare Axon Devices are intended to replace broken or non-functioning units while Agency submits the broken or non-functioning units, through Axon's warranty return process. Axon will repair or replace the unit with a replacement Axon Device. Title and risk of loss for all Spare Axon Devices shall pass to Agency in accordance with shipping terms under Section 5. Axon assumes no liability or obligation in the e/vent Agency does not utilize Spare Axon Devices for the intended purpose.
- 7.4. Limitations. Axon's warranty excludes damage related to: (a) failure to follow Axon Device use instructions; (b) Axon Devices used with equipment not manufactured or recommended by Axon; (c) abuse, misuse, or intentional damage to Axon Device; (d) force majeure; (e) Axon Devices repaired or modified by persons other than Axon without Axon's written permission; or (f) Axon Devices with a defaced or removed serial number. Axon's warranty will be void if Agency resells Axon Devices.
 - 7.4.1. To the extent permitted by law, the above warranties and remedies are exclusive. Axon disclaims all other warranties, remedies, and conditions, whether oral, written, statutory, or implied. If statutory or implied warranties cannot be lawfully disclaimed, then such warranties are limited to the duration of the warranty described above and by the provisions in this Agreement.
 - 7.4.2. Axon's cumulative liability to any Party for any loss or damage resulting from any claim, demand, or action arising out of or relating to any Axon Device or Service will not exceed the purchase price paid to Axon for the Axon Device, or if for Services, the amount paid for such Services over the 12 months preceding the claim. Neither Party will be liable for direct, special, indirect, incidental, punitive or consequential damages, however caused, whether for breach of warranty or contract, negligence, strict liability, tort or any other legal theory.
- 7.5. **Third-Party Software and Services**. Use of software or services other than those provided by Axon may be governed by the terms, if any, entered into between Agency and the respective third-party provider.
- 7.6. **Axon Aid**. Upon mutual agreement between Axon and Agency, Axon may provide certain products and services to Agency, as a charitable donation under the Axon Aid program. In such event, Agency expressly waives and releases any and all claims, now known or hereafter known, against Axon, and its officers, directors, employees, agents, contractors, affiliates, successors, and assigns (collectively, "Releasees"), including but not limited to, on account of injury, death, property damage, or loss of data, arising out of or attributable to the Axon Aid program whether arising out of the negligence of Axon or any Releasees or otherwise. Agency agrees not to make or bring any such claim against Axon or any other Releasee, and forever release and discharge Axon and all other Releasees from liability under such claims. Agency expressly allows Axon to publicly announce its participation in Axon Aid and use its name in marketing materials. Axon may terminate the Axon Aid program without cause immediately upon notice to the Agency.
- 8. <u>Statement of Work</u>. Axon Fleet includes a a Statement of Work that details Axon's Service deliverables ("**SOW**"). The SOW for Axon Fleet is included in the attached Quote for Fleet 3 Advanced and incorporated herein by reference. The Parties must document any changes to the SOW in a written and signed change order. Changes may require an equitable adjustment in fees or schedule.
- 9. Axon Device Warnings. See www.axon.com/legal for the most current Axon Device warnings.
- 10. <u>Design Changes</u>. Axon may make design changes to any Axon Device or Service without notifying Agency or making the same change to Axon Devices and Services previously purchased by Agency.
- 11. <u>Bundled Offerings</u>. Some offerings in bundled offerings may not be generally available at the time of Agency's purchase. Axon will not provide a refund, credit, or additional discount beyond what is in the Quote due to a delay of availability or Agency's election not to utilize any portion of an Axon bundle.
- 12. <u>Insurance</u>. Axon will maintain General Liability, Workers' Compensation, and Automobile Liability insurance. Upon request, Axon will supply certificates of insurance.
- 13. IP Rights. Axon owns and reserves all right, title, and interest in Axon-manufactured Devices and Services and

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suggestions to Axon, including all related intellectual property rights. Agency will not cause any Axon proprietary rights to be violated.

- 14. IP Indemnification. Axon will indemnify Agency Indemnitees against all claims, losses, and reasonable expenses from any third-party claim alleging that the use of Axon-manufactured Devices or Services infringes or misappropriates the third-party's intellectual property rights. Agency must promptly provide Axon with written notice of such claim, tender to Axon the defense or settlement of such claim at Axon's expense and cooperate fully with Axon in the defense or settlement of such claim. Axon's IP indemnification obligations do not apply to claims based on (a) modification of Axon-manufactured Devices or Services by Agency or a third-party not approved by Axon; (b) use of Axon-manufactured Devices and Services in combination with hardware or services not approved by Axon; (c) use of Axon Devices and Services other than as permitted in this Agreement; or (d) use of Axon software that is not the most current release provided by Axon.
- 15. <u>Agency Responsibilities</u>. Agency is responsible for (a) Agency's use of Axon Devices; (b) breach of this Agreement or violation of applicable law by Agency or an Agency end user; and (c) a dispute between Agency and a third-party over Agency's use of Axon Devices.

16. Termination.

- 16.1. For Breach. A Party may terminate this Agreement for cause if it provides 30 days written notice of the breach to the other Party, and the breach remains uncured at the end of 30 days. If Agency terminates this Agreement due to Axon's uncured breach, Axon will refund prepaid amounts on a prorated basis based on the effective date of termination.
- 16.2. For Non-Appropriation of Funds. If sufficient funds are not appropriated or otherwise legally available to pay the fees, Agency may terminate this Agreement. Agency will deliver notice of termination under this section as soon as reasonably practicable.
- 16.3. **For Improper Dealings.** In the event any Axon employee or Illinois government official is charged with a crime or is found by any Illinois ethics or administrative investigation to have acted improperly relating to lobbying, influencing or attempting to influence the procurement process involving police body cameras, Agency shall have the right to terminate contract without penalty or cause.
- 16.4. Effect of Termination. Upon termination of this Agreement, Agency rights extend only to the extent outlined in this Agreement and its Appendices. Agency remains responsible for all fees incurred before the effective date of termination and penalty calculations as outlined in the Penalty Calculation Appendix attached hereto and incorporated herein. Only if terminating for non-appropriation, Agency may return Axon Devices to Axon within 30 days of termination.
- 17. Confidentiality. "Confidential Information" means nonpublic information designated as confidential or, given the nature of the information or circumstances surrounding disclosure, should reasonably be understood to be confidential. Each Party will take reasonable measures to avoid disclosure, dissemination, or unauthorized use of the other Party's Confidential Information. Unless required by law, neither Party will disclose the other Party's Confidential Information during the Term and for 5 years thereafter. To the extent permissible by law, Axon pricing is Confidential Information and competition sensitive. If Agency receives a public records request to disclose Axon Confidential Information, to the extent allowed by law, Agency will exercise reasonable efforts to provide notice to Axon before disclosure. Agency's compliance with any such public records request will not constitute a breach of this provision. Axon may publicly announce information related to this Agreement.
- 18. <u>Illinois Freedom of Information Act.</u> Axon shall make all reasonable efforts to assist Agency with responding to public information requests for documents pertaining to this contract in compliance with the Illinois Freedom of Information Act. Nothing in this section shall be construed as an obligation on the part of AXON to assist Agency beyond the scope of the software services outlined in this Agreement as it relates to public information requests for Agency Content as defined in the Appendix "Axon Cloud Services Terms of Use."

19. General.

- 19.1. Force Majeure. Neither Party will be liable for any delay or failure to perform due to a cause beyond a Party's reasonable control.
- 19.2. **Independent Contractors**. The Parties are independent contractors. Neither Party has the authority to bind the other. This Agreement does not create a partnership, franchise, joint venture, agency, fiduciary, or employment relationship between the Parties.
- 19.3. Third-Party Beneficiaries. There are no third-party beneficiaries under this Agreement.
- 19.4. Non-Discrimination. Neither Party nor its employees will discriminate against any person based on race;

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religion; creed; color; sex; gender identity and expression; pregnancy; childbirth; breastfeeding; medical conditions related to pregnancy, childbirth, or breastfeeding; sexual orientation; marital status; age; national origin; ancestry; genetic information; disability; veteran status; or any class protected by local, state, or federal law.

- 19.5. Export Compliance. Each Party will comply with all import and export control laws and regulations.
- 19.6. Assignment. Neither Party may assign this Agreement without the other Party's prior written consent. Axon may assign this Agreement, its rights, or obligations with notice to Agency: (a) to an affiliate or subsidiary; or (b) for purposes of financing, merger, acquisition, corporate reorganization, or sale of all or substantially all its assets. In the event of assignment by Axon with notice as outlined in (a) and (b) of 19.6, Agency shall have 30 days to terminate this Agreement without cause or penalty. This Agreement is binding upon the Parties respective successors and assigns.
- 19.7. Waiver. No waiver or delay by either Party in exercising any right under this Agreement constitutes a waiver of that right.
- 19.8. **Severability**. If a court of competent jurisdiction holds any portion of this Agreement invalid or unenforceable, the remaining portions of this Agreement will remain in effect.
- 19.9. **Survival**. The following sections will survive termination: Payment, Warranty, Axon Device Warnings, Indemnification, IP Rights, and Agency Responsibilities.
- 19.10. **Governing Law**. The laws of the state of Illinois, govern this Agreement and any dispute arising from it. The United Nations Convention for the International Sale of Goods does not apply to this Agreement.
- 19.11. Notices. All notices must be in English. Notices posted on Agency's Axon Evidence site are effective upon posting. Notices by email are effective on the sent date of the email. Notices by personal delivery are effective immediately. Contact information for notices:

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Axon Cloud Services Terms of Use Appendix

Definitions.

- 1.1. "Agency Content" is data uploaded into, ingested by, or created in Axon Cloud Services within Agency's tenant, including media or multimedia uploaded into Axon Cloud Services by Agency. Agency Content includes Evidence but excludes Non-Content Data.
- 1.2. "Evidence" is media or multimedia uploaded into Axon Evidence as 'evidence' by an Agency. Evidence is a subset of Agency Content.
- 1.3. "Non-Content Data" is data, configuration, and usage information about Agency's Axon Cloud Services tenant, Axon Devices and client software, and users that is transmitted or generated when using Axon Devices. Non-Content Data includes data about users captured during account management and customer support activities. Non-Content Data does not include Agency Content.
- 1.4. "Personal Data" means any information relating to an identified or identifiable natural person. An identifiable natural person is one who can be identified, directly or indirectly, in particular by reference to an identifier such as a name, an identification number, location data, an online identifier or to one or more factors specific to the physical, physiological, genetic, mental, economic, cultural or social identity of that natural person.
- 2. <u>Access</u>. Upon Axon granting Agency a subscription to Axon Cloud Services, Agency may access and use Axon Cloud Services to store and manage Agency Content. Agency may not exceed more end users than the Quote specifies. Axon Air requires an Axon Evidence subscription for each drone operator. For Axon Evidence Lite, Agency may access and use Axon Evidence only to store and manage TASER CEW and TASER CAM data ("TASER Data"). Agency may not upload non-TASER Data to Axon Evidence Lite.
- 3. Agency Owns Agency Content. Agency controls and owns all right, title, and interest in Agency Content. Except as outlined herein, Axon obtains no interest in Agency Content, and Agency Content is not Axon's business records. Agency is solely responsible for uploading, sharing, managing, and deleting Agency Content. Axon will only have access to Agency Content for the limited purposes set forth herein. Agency agrees to allow Axon access to Agency Content to (a) perform troubleshooting, maintenance, or diagnostic screenings; and (b) enforce this Agreement or policies governing use of the Axon products.
- 4. **Security**. Axon will implement commercially reasonable and appropriate measures to secure Agency Content against accidental or unlawful loss, access or disclosure. Axon will maintain a comprehensive information security program to protect Axon Cloud Services and Agency Content including logical, physical access, vulnerability, risk, and configuration management; incident monitoring and response; encryption of uploaded digital evidence; security education; and data protection. Axon agrees to the Federal Bureau of Investigation Criminal Justice Information Services Security Addendum.
- 5. <u>Agency Responsibilities</u>. Agency is responsible for (a) ensuring Agency owns Agency Content; (b) ensuring no Agency Content or Agency end user's use of Agency Content or Axon Cloud Services violates this Agreement or applicable laws; and (c) maintaining necessary computer equipment and Internet connections for use of Axon Cloud Services. If Agency becomes aware of any violation of this Agreement by an end user, Agency will immediately terminate that end user's access to Axon Cloud Services.
 - 1.5. Agency will also maintain the security of end usernames and passwords and security and access by end users to Agency Content. Agency is responsible for ensuring the configuration and utilization of Axon Cloud Services meet applicable Agency regulation and standards. Agency may not sell, transfer, or sublicense access to any other entity or person. Agency shall contact Axon immediately if an unauthorized party may be using Agency's account or Agency Content, or if account information is lost or stolen.
 - 1.6. To the extent Agency uses the Axon Cloud Services to interact with YouTube®, such use may be governed by the YouTube Terms of Service, available at https://www.youtube.com/static?template=terms.
- 6. <u>Privacy</u>. Agency's use of Axon Cloud Services is subject to the Axon Cloud Services Privacy Policy, a current version of which is available at https://www.axon.com/legal/cloud-services-privacy-policy. Agency agrees to allow Axon access to Non-Content Data from Agency to (a) perform troubleshooting, maintenance, or

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diagnostic screenings; (b) provide, develop, improve, and support current and future Axon products and related services; and (c) enforce this Agreement or policies governing the use of Axon products.

- 7. Axon Body 3 Wi-Fi Positioning. Axon Body 3 cameras offer a feature to enhance location services where GPS/GNSS signals may not be available, for instance, within buildings or underground. Agency administrators can manage their choice to use this service within the administrative features of Axon Cloud Services. If Agency chooses to use this service, Axon must also enable the usage of the feature for Agency's Axon Cloud Services tenant. Agency will not see this option with Axon Cloud Services unless Axon has enabled Wi-Fi Positioning for Agency's Axon Cloud Services tenant. When Wi-Fi Positioning is enabled by both Axon and Agency, Non-Content and Personal Data will be sent to Skyhook Holdings, Inc. ("Skyhook") to facilitate the Wi-Fi Positioning functionality. Data controlled by Skyhook is outside the scope of the Axon Cloud Services Privacy Policy and is subject to the Skyhook Services Privacy Policy.
- 8. <u>Storage</u>. For Axon Unlimited Device Storage subscriptions, Agency may store unlimited data in Agency's Axon Evidence account only if data originates from Axon Capture or the applicable Axon Device. Axon may charge Agency additional fees for exceeding purchased storage amounts. Axon may place Agency Content that Agency has not viewed or accessed for 6 months into archival storage. Agency Content in archival storage will not have immediate availability and may take up to 24 hours to access.
- Location of Storage. Axon may transfer Agency Content to third-party subcontractors for storage. Axon will
 determine the locations of data centers for storage of Agency Content. For United States agencies, Axon will
 ensure all Agency Content stored in Axon Cloud Services remains within the United States. Ownership of
 Agency Content remains with Agency.
- 10. <u>Suspension</u>. Axon may temporarily suspend Agency's or any end user's right to access or use any portion or all of Axon Cloud Services immediately upon notice, if Agency or end user's use of or registration for Axon Cloud Services may (a) pose a security risk to Axon Cloud Services or any third-party; (b) adversely impact Axon Cloud Services, the systems, or content of any other customer; (c) subject Axon, Axon's affiliates, or any third-party to liability; or (d) be fraudulent. Agency remains responsible for all fees incurred through suspension. Axon will not delete Agency Content because of suspension, except as specified in this Agreement.
- 11. <u>Axon Cloud Services Warranty</u>. Axon disclaims any warranties or responsibility for data corruption or errors before Agency uploads data to Axon Cloud Services.
- 12. <u>Axon Records</u>. Axon Records is the software-as-a-service product that is generally available at the time Agency purchases an OSP 7 bundle. During Agency's Axon Records Subscription Term, if any, Agency will be entitled to receive Axon's Update and Upgrade releases on an if-and-when available basis.
 - 1.7. The Axon Records Subscription Term will end upon the competition of the Axon Records Subscription as documented in the Quote, or if purchased as part of an OSP 7 bundle, upon competition of the OSP 7 Term ("Axon Records Subscription")
 - 1.8. An "Update" is a generally available release of Axon Records that Axon makes available from time to time. An "Upgrade" includes (i) new versions of Axon Records that enhance features and functionality, as solely determined by Axon; and/or (ii) new versions of Axon Records that provide additional features or perform additional functions. Upgrades exclude new products that Axon introduces and markets as distinct products or applications.
 - 1.9. New or additional Axon products and applications, as well as any Axon professional services needed to configure Axon Records, are not included. If Agency purchases Axon Records as part of a bundled offering, the Axon Record subscription begins on the later of the (1) start date of that bundled offering, or (2) date Axon provisions Axon Records to Agency.
 - 1.10. Users of Axon Records at the agency may upload files to entities (incidents, reports, cases, etc) in Axon Records with no limit to the number of files and amount of storage. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Axon may limit usage should the Agency exceed an average rate of 100 GB per user per year of uploaded files. Axon will not bill for overages.
- Axon Cloud Services Restrictions. Agency and Agency end users (including employees, contractors, agents, officers, volunteers, and directors), may not, or may not attempt to:
 - 1.11. copy, modify, tamper with, repair, or create derivative works of any part of Axon Cloud Services;

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- 1.12. reverse engineer, disassemble, or decompile Axon Cloud Services or apply any process to derive any source code included in Axon Cloud Services, or allow others to do the same;
- 1.13. access or use Axon Cloud Services with the intent to gain unauthorized access, avoid incurring fees or exceeding usage limits or quotas;
- 1.14. use trade secret information contained in Axon Cloud Services, except as expressly permitted in this Agreement;
- 1.15. access Axon Cloud Services to build a competitive device or service or copy any features, functions, or graphics of Axon Cloud Services:
- 1.16. remove, alter, or obscure any confidentiality or proprietary rights notices (including copyright and trademark notices) of Axon's or Axon's licensors on or within Axon Cloud Services; or
- 1.17. use Axon Cloud Services to store or transmit infringing, libelous, or other unlawful or tortious material; to store or transmit material in violation of third-party privacy rights; or to store or transmit malicious code.
- 14. <u>After Termination</u>. Axon will not delete Agency Content for 90 days following termination. There will be no functionality of Axon Cloud Services during these 90 days other than the ability to retrieve Agency Content. Agency will not incur additional fees if Agency downloads Agency Content from Axon Cloud Services during this time. Axon has no obligation to maintain or provide Agency Content after these 90-days and will thereafter, unless legally prohibited, delete all Agency Content. Upon request, Axon will provide written proof that Axon successfully deleted and fully removed all Agency Content from Axon Cloud Services.
- 15. Post-Termination Assistance. Axon will provide Agency with the same post-termination data retrieval assistance that Axon generally makes available to all customers. Requests for Axon to provide additional assistance in downloading or transferring Agency Content, including requests for Axon's data egress service, will result in additional fees and Axon will not warrant or guarantee data integrity or readability in the external system.
- 16. <u>U.S. Government Rights</u>. If Agency is a U.S. Federal department or using Axon Cloud Services on behalf of a U.S. Federal department, Axon Cloud Services is provided as a "commercial item," "commercial computer software," "commercial computer software documentation," and "technical data", as defined in the Federal Acquisition Regulation and Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement. If Agency is using Axon Cloud Services on behalf of the U.S. Government and these terms fail to meet the U.S. Government's needs or are inconsistent in any respect with federal law, Agency will immediately discontinue use of Axon Cloud Services.
- 17. <u>Survival</u>. Upon any termination of this Agreement, the following sections in this Appendix will survive: Agency Owns Agency Content, Privacy, Storage, Axon Cloud Services Warranty, and Axon Cloud Services Restrictions.

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Axon Customer Experience Improvement Program Appendix

1. Axon Customer Experience Improvement Program (ACEIP). The ACEIP is designed to accelerate Axon's development of technology, such as building and supporting automated features, to ultimately increase safety within communities and drive efficiency in public safety. To this end, subject to the limitations on Axon as described below, Axon, where allowed by law, may make limited use of Agency Content from all of its customers, to provide, develop, improve, and support current and future Axon products (collectively, "ACEIP Purposes"). However, at all times, Axon will comply with its obligations pursuant to the Axon Cloud Services Terms of Use Appendix to maintain a comprehensive data security program (including compliance with the CJIS Security Policy for Criminal Justice Information), privacy program, and data governance policy, including high industry standards of de-identifying Personal Data, to enforce its security and privacy obligations for the ACEIP. ACEIP has 2 tiers of participation, Tier 1 and Tier 2. By default, Agency will be a participant in ACEIP Tier 1. If Agency does not want to participate in ACEIP Tier 1, Agency can revoke its consent at any time. If Agency does not want to participate in ACEIP Tier 2, Agency should leave box unchecked. At any time, Agency may revoke its consent to ACEIP Tier 1, Tier 2, or both Tiers.

2. ACEIP Tier 1.

- When Axon uses Agency Content for the ACEIP Purposes, Axon will extract from Agency Content and may store separately copies of certain segments or elements of the Agency Content (collectively, "ACEIP Content"). When extracting ACEIP Content, Axon will use commercially reasonable efforts to aggregate, transform or de-identify Agency Content so that the extracted ACEIP Content is no longer reasonably capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked directly or indirectly to a particular individual ("Privacy Preserving Technique(s)"). For illustrative purposes, some examples are described in footnote 11. For clarity, ACEIP Content will still be linked indirectly, with an attribution, to the Agency from which it was extracted. This attribution will be stored separately from the data itself, but is necessary for and will be solely used to enable Axon to identify and delete all ACEIP Content upon Agency request. Once de-identified, ACEIP Content may then be further modified, analyzed, and used to create derivative works. At any time, Agency may revoke the consent granted herein to Axon to access and use Agency Content for ACEIP Purposes. Within 30 days of receiving the Agency's request, Axon will no longer access or use Agency Content for ACEIP Purposes and will delete any and all ACEIP Content. Axon will also delete any derivative works which may reasonably be capable of being associated with, or could reasonably be linked directly or indirectly to Agency. In addition, if Axon uses Agency Content for the ACEIP Purposes, upon request, Axon will make available to Agency a list of the specific type of Agency Content being used to generate ACEIP Content, the purpose of such use, and the retention, privacy preserving extraction technique, and relevant data protection practices applicable to the Agency Content or ACEIP Content ("Use Case"). From time to time, Axon may develop and deploy new Use Cases. At least 30 days prior to authorizing the deployment of any new Use Case, Axon will provide Agency notice (by updating the list of Use Case at https://www.axon.com/aceip and providing Agency with a mechanism to obtain notice of that update or another commercially reasonable method to Agency designated contact) ("New Use Case").
- 2.2. Expiration of ACEIP Tier 1. Agency consent granted herein, will expire upon termination of the Agreement. In accordance with section 1.1.1, within 30 days of receiving the Agency's request, Axon will no longer access or use Agency Content for ACEIP Purposes and will delete ACEIP

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¹ For example; (a) when extracting specific text to improve automated transcription capabilities, text that could be used to directly identify a particular individual would not be extracted, and extracted text would be disassociated from identifying metadata of any speakers, and the extracted text would be split into individual words and aggregated with other data sources (including publicly available data) to remove any reasonable ability to link any specific text directly or indirectly back to a particular individual; (b) when extracting license plate data to improve Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR) capabilities, individual license plate characters would be extracted and disassociated from each other so a complete plate could not be reconstituted, and all association to other elements of the source video, such as the vehicle, location, time, and the surrounding environment would also be removed; (c) when extracting audio of potential acoustic events (such as glass breaking or gun shots), very short segments (<1 second) of audio that only contains the likely acoustic events would be extracted and all human utterances would be removed.

3. ACEIP Tier 2. In addition to ACEIP Tier 1, if Agency wants to help further improve Axon's services, Agency may choose to participate in Tier 2 of the ACEIP. ACEIP Tier 2 grants Axon certain additional rights to use Agency Content, in addition to those set forth in Tier 1 above, without the guaranteed deployment of a Privacy Preserving Technique to enable product development, improvement, and support that cannot be accomplished with aggregated, transformed or de-identified data.

- 10. Access Computer Systems to Perform Services. Agency authorizes Axon to access relevant Agency computers and networks, solely for performing the Services. Axon will work to identify as soon as reasonably practicable resources and information Axon expects to use and will provide an initial itemized list to Agency. Agency is responsible for and assumes the risk of any problems, delays, losses, claims, or expenses resulting from the content, accuracy, completeness, and consistency of all data, materials, and information supplied by Agency.

PATROL DIVISION ACTIVITY REPORT

During the month of August the Patrol Division responded to 3121 calls for service. The following is a brief summary of some of the activities:

On O1 August, Nights A Platoon responded to the 600 block of Hill Drive to assist HEFD for a 10-month old who suffered a heat related seizure. Upon arrival, officers observed the apartment to be hot and humid with no air conditioning and no fans running. As HEFD tended to the 10-month old, officers moved all other children from the apartment to a cooler location and began to contact parents to pick up the children. Officers spoke to all adults in the apartment and learned the resident was operating an in-home daycare. DCFS was contacted and advised they were sending a case worker to investigate. All adults were transported to the station for interviews and gave statements. All adults from the apartment were released and this case in currently under investigation. Code Enforcement was also notified.

On O1 August, Officer Kassidy Ortiz was monitoring traffic in the area of Higgins Road and Greenspoint Parkway. She observed a vehicle traveling 86 mph in a 55 mph zone. She stopped the vehicle and spoke to the driver. The driver, a 24-year old resident of Chicago, was arrested for Aggravated Speeding. The driver was transported to the station, processed and released on bond.

On O1 August, Officer Perez observed a vehicle traveling northbound on Roselle Road from Golf Road. The vehicle was observed weaving out of its lane of travel and nearly struck a Schaumburg police officer on a traffic stop. Officer Perez conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and spoke to the driver. The driver showed several signs of alcohol intoxication and refused lawful orders given by Officer Perez. The driver, a 31-year old resident of Palatine, was placed under arrest. The driver was charged with Obstructing a Police Officer, DUI, Failure to Change Lanes when Approaching a Stopped Emergency Vehicle and Illegal Transportation of Alcohol. The driver posted bond and was released from custody.

On 02 August, Officer Slager was conducting traffic enforcement in the area of Higgins Road and Audubon Street. He observed a vehicle traveling 85 mph in a 45 mph zone. He stopped the vehicle and spoke to the driver who admitted to "driving fast because there were no other cars around." The driver, a 20-year old resident of Chicago, was arrested for Aggravated Speeding. The driver was transported to the station, processed and released on bond.

On 04 August, Officer Villagomez responded to the 1700 block of Jamestown Circle for a report of a battery. Officer Villagomez spoke to the victim who stated she was walking on Abbeywood Drive when an unknown male subject approached her from behind and pulled down her pants and underwear. The offender then fled toward John Muir School. The victim provided a clothing description. Due to similar incidents in the past, officers responded to the 1800 block of Jamestown Circle to speak to a possible suspect. Officers located the subject who was wearing similar clothing described by the victim. The

victim positively identified the suspect as the offender in the battery. The offender, a 14-year old resident of Hoffman Estates, was placed under arrest and transported to the station with his grandmother. The offender was charged with Battery and released to the custody of his grandmother.

On O6 August, Sergeant Boulahanis observed a vehicle traveling southbound on Roselle Road from Higgins Road. He observed the vehicle had a turn signal activated while traveling in the straight lane. The vehicle then made a left turn, from the straight lane, while the left turn signal was red. Sergeant Boulahanis initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle. As the vehicle came to a stop, Sergeant Boulahanis observed the driver and front seat passenger switched positions by climbing over the center console. Upon speaking to both subjects, Sergeant Boulahanis observed signs of alcohol intoxication in both vehicle occupants. After conducting an investigation, both vehicle occupants were placed under arrest for DUI. A 47-year old resident of Mundelein and 52-year old resident of Addison were transported to the station. Both offenders were processed and released after posting bond.

On 10 August, Nights A Platoon responded to several calls of burglary to motor vehicles in Area 8 (Barberry Court; Parkside Drive; North Alder Drive; Whispering Trails Drive; and Chestnut Lane.) Officers learned that several male subjects were in the area attempting to open vehicle doors. In total, the offenders found 7 unlocked vehicles and stole various items left inside the vehicles. Patrol officers and detectives conducted a canvass of the area and located Ring Doorbell footage of the offenders attempting to gain entry into the vehicles. This investigation is still on-going, but suspects have been identified and detectives have obtained warrants for the arrest of those offenders.

On 11 August, Officers responded to the 900 block of Atlantic Avenue for a report of a domestic battery. The victim called 911 and stated her husband hit her with a chair and she was bleeding from her face. The offender, a 40-year old resident of Hoffman Estates, is known by officers to be violent and carry weapons. Upon arrival, officers were able to investigate the incident and take the offender into custody without incident. The offender was processed and lodged in a cell to await a bond hearing. The victim was transported to St. Alexius Medical Center with her two young children.

On 14 August, Officer Bong responded to a residence in the 600 block of Western Street for a report of a drug overdose. Officer Bong spoke to the caller who stated her daughter had been attending drug rehabilitation for a heroin addiction and was currently on the bedroom floor unconscious. Officer Bong located the subject and observed her to have agonal breathing and turning blue in the face. Officer Bong administered 2 doses of Narcan and the subject regained consciousness. She was ultimately transported to St. Alexius Medical Center by HEFD.

On 21 August, Officer Buch was on patrol in the area of Higgins Road and Volid Drive. He observed a vehicle traveling eastbound on Higgins Road in the westbound lanes of travel. A HEFD ambulance was traveling westbound at this time and activated the ambulance horn in an attempt gain the drivers attention. Officer Buch conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle and spoke to the driver. He observed signs of alcohol impairment on the driver and conducted a DUI investigation. Ultimately, the driver of the vehicle, a 40- year old resident of Lombard, was placed under arrest for DUI.

INVESTIGATIONS DIVISION REPORT

Detective Garcia was assigned to a stolen auto report where during the early morning hours a 2020 Ford Edge was stolen from the 1100 block of Hunters Ridge East. The vehicle was parked in the driveway with the doors unlocked and the keys in the vehicle. Multiple burglaries to motor vehicle were reported that night to unlocked vehicles as well. The Ford was recovered unoccupied on August 15, in Rockford. The Ford was processed for evidence and this case is cleared by Recovery pending the results of processed evidence.

Detective Garcia was assigned to a stolen auto report where during the overnight hours a 2013 Mercedes-Benz was stolen from the 5300 block of Elliot Drive. The vehicle was parked in the driveway with the doors unlocked and the keys in the vehicle. Multiple burglaries to motor vehicle were reported that night to unlocked vehicles as well. The Mercedes-Benz was recovered unoccupied in Belvidere on August 16. The vehicle was processed for evidence and this case is cleared by Recovery pending the results of processed evidence.

Detective Garcia was assigned to a stolen auto report where during the overnight hours a 2016 Ford was stolen while parked on the street on Harmon Boulevard. Per the owner, the vehicle was locked and he still had the keys to the vehicle. On August 1, the Ford was recovered unoccupied with heavy front-end damage in Richton Park. After contacting the owner and showing him the Ford, he did not wish to pursue charges or have the Ford processed for evidence. This case is cleared by Recovery.

Detective Fesemyer assisted in the investigation of a recovery of a possible stolen auto that occurred at the 600 block of Bode Circle. The Tactical Unit located the vehicle that was involved in a hit and run. Tactical Officer Bartolone's investigation led to the possibility that the vehicle may have had a fake VIN attached to VIN location on the left side of the windshield. Detective Fesemyer wrote a search warrant so that investigators were able to access the vehicle. Recovered was the real VIN, showing that the vehicle had been stolen out of Chicago. This case was later cleared by Recovery.

Detective Fesemyer investigated a criminal damage to property that occurred at the 1800 block of Jamestown Circle. Detective Fesemyer learned that the 54 year-old Hoffman Estates resident's vehicle had been damaged by her 18 year-old son during a domestic dispute. Detective Fesemyer spoke to the victim who later decided that she did not wish to pursue charges. This case was Exceptionally Cleared.

Detective Fesemyer investigated a case of intimidation that occurred at the 4500 block of Opal Drive. Detective Fesemyer interviewed the 38 year-old Hoffman Estates resident who showed text messages that her 41 year-old estranged husband, a Schaumburg resident, had sent her. The text messages were sent by the offender telling the victim

to have an order of protection, where the victim's sister was the petitioner, dismissed. The offender threatened to post nude photographs of the victim, if she did not comply. Felony Review was contacted and approved Felony charges of Intimidation and Misdemeanor charges of Harassment by Electronic Communication. The investigation also led to discovery of a violation of an order of protection in McHenry County where it was issued. This case was Cleared by Arrest.

Detective Fesemyer investigated a case of domestic battery that occurred at the 500 block of Mesa Drive. Detective Fesemyer spoke to the 30 year-old Hoffman Estates resident, who explained that she was strangled by her 36 year-old live-in boyfriend. Detective Fesemyer searched for the offender with negative results; however, was able to obtain an arrest warrant for Domestic Battery. This case is Cleared by Arrest pending service of the arrest warrant.

Detective Parks had been working a retail theft that had occurred at the 2600 block of New Sutton Road. The suspect had previously been indicted on charges by a grand jury and was in custody in Lake County on a different case. Detective Parks was able to present evidence in his case, which caused the suspect to be brought in front of a judge at the 3rd District courthouse, where he received approval for a Felony charge of Retail Theft. This case was Cleared by Arrest.

JUVENILE INVESTIGATIONS SECTION REPORT



TACTICAL UNIT REPORT

On August 02, TAC Officers attended in-service training.

On August 05, the TAC Unit assisted on a hit and run crash. Officers were approached by a witness who confirmed the suspect vehicle was parked in the apartment parking lot. The vehicle was towed, an attempt to locate the registered owner was negative. While looking further into the vehicle, it was noted the vehicle per VIN number had never left Canada. An internet search of the VIN provided showed the vehicle was currently for sale in Canada. A search warrant was obtained for the vehicle, the original VIN was located and confirmed as a stolen vehicle. The registered owner of the vehicle was interviewed and confirmed to be an unwitting suspect.

The TAC Unit conducted surveillance in North Hoffman August 10-20, regarding the burglary to motor vehicle cases. While conducting surveillance, a possible suspect was located driving the suspected vehicle. The driver fled and was later identified as a resident of Hoffman Estates. Warrants were obtained for Aggravated Fleeing and Eluding. The case is pending.

On August 23, TAC officers conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle leaving a known drug house. The stop resulted in a resident of Huntley being arrested for Possession of Crack Cocaine and Drug Paraphernalia.

On August 26, Tac officers responded to a residence in Area 1 for a domestic battery, which resulted in the arrest of a Hoffman Estates resident.

On August 29, the TAC Unit participated in a controlled buy with the North Central Narcotics Task Force at a known drug house.

TRAFFIC SECTION REPORT

The Traffic Section reviewed 17 hit and run traffic crash reports during the month of August 2022.

Ofc. Kubat followed up on a hit & run crash in the area of Barrington Rd and I-90 for a motorcycle that was hit by a vehicle. Ofc. Kubat started gathering information from victim and several on-scene witnesses. Along with witness statements and Go-Pro camera footage from victim helmet, and offending vehicle was identified. Ofc. Kubat then responded to the offending vehicle's address where the vehicle was located. ofc. Kubat continued his investigation and learn that the suspect was currently on home monitoring and wearing an ankle bracelet with GPS tracking. Ofc. Kubat contacted Cook County Probation and was able to obtain GPS coordinates which coincided with the route the offending vehicle was observed traveling while fleeing the scene. Ofc. Kubat also obtained video surveillance from area businesses which captured the suspect driving the offending vehicle just minutes after the crash occurred. With this information, Ofc. Kubat interviewed the suspect and obtained a written confession. This information was then given to the Cook County State's Attorney's Office and a felony indictment was approved.

The Traffic Section conducted 3 child seat inspections & installations.

During August 2022 Sergeant Wondolkowski processed 27 oversize/overweight permits through the Oxcart permit system.

Our two departments had already been working together to help identify and stop this violent offender from victimizing more individuals and businesses in our towns, so when the opportunity to conduct surveillance operations in an effort to gather more evidence against him presented itself, members of our two lavestigations. Units coordinated their efforts and were able to arrest the offender, Reginald Drake, on June 23, 2022 and charge him initially with 2 counts of aggravated robbery for the Streamwood cases and one count of aggravated robbery for the Hoffman Estates case.



Prevention & Wellness

The 2021-2022 Psychology Training Program interns and externs completed their training with the Village of Hoffman Estates Health and Human Services on August 19, 2022. Throughout their year in HHS, students provided direct clinical therapy services, psychological testing services, community workshops and presentations, and developed and attended community events and resource fairs. Their contributions to serving the community have been exemplary and they will be missed as they move on to their next levels of training. Congratulations to Dr. Urennaya Okoro, Dr. Justin Chu, Meena Chockalingam, Jasmin Dhillon, Jordan Stein, and Sam Martin.

Nursing staff Cathy Dagian and Gina McCauley hosted a nursing in-service for all clinic and pool

nurses on August 29, 2022. Training included a presentation on new vaccines including Meningitis, Vaxcelis, and Flu by representatives from Sanofi Pasteur. Community Health Nurse Gina McCauley presented on Decreasing Anxiety and Pain During Immunizations, Immunization Techniques, and Blood-Borne Pathogen Training. Cathy Dagian led the training on vaccine updates and clinic policy review.



Health and Human Services is dedicated to providing quality health services to the community. During the month of August, HHS focused on providing children's back to school vaccine clinics and preventative adult services. In August, nursing staff provided 198 infant and children's vaccinations and provided 2 adult immunizations. Through these vaccinations, a total of 358 child antigens and 4 adult antigens were administered. Two (2) Tdap and al 317 Program vaccinations were administered. Thirty-seven (37) preventative screenings were completed which include Tanita body analysis(6), blood pressure(10), blood sugar (4) and pulse (7) screenings, A1C (3), and TB(7) tests. Nursing staff provided 45 hours of consultation during the month of August. During the month of August, one hundred seventy (170) Vision and Hearing screenings were conducted for children in day cares and preschools.

Treatment and Crisis Response

Health and Human Services provides in-person therapy services telehealth psychotherapy services for

the community and Village employees. During the month of August, HHS clinical psychology staff served 100 clients and provided 162 hours of individual counseling, 6 hours of couples counseling, 2 hours of family counseling, and 5 clinical intakes. Therapy services address a variety of mental health concerns including depression, anxiety, trauma, grief, sui-



cidal ideation, and family conflict. HHS continues to have a wait list for therapy services due to the high demand for mental health counseling. Due to the current psychology training cohort ending their training year in August, clients who are transferring to a new therapist in September will be assigned to new therapists to begin treatment in mid-September. Residents who call in for services will be provided referrals or placed on the wait list for services to start in September.

During the month of August, Health and Human Services staff and the Police Social Worker



conducted crisis outreach and intervention. During August, HHS staff provided 10 hours of crisis intervention. Crisis intervention services include providing assistance and resources to residents facing mental health emergencies homelessness, domestic violence, and the need for substance abuse referrals. During the month of August, Police Social Worker, Nataly Correa, completed 88 hours of crisis calls in the community. These calls including providing resources and on-

site visits for domestic violence, hoarding, homelessness, substance abuse referrals, mental illness referrals for services, and senior care.

Community Events

Dr. Audra Marks and Nataly Correa attended the Eisenhower Community Resource Fair on August 10, 2022 at Eisenhower Jr. High. Health and Human Services shared resources for counseling services, crisis management resources and health information. HHS partners with School District 54 for the CAP program which provides families in need of mental health services with 5 sessions paid for by the school district. Children are identified by school social workers and teachers and are referred for the CAP program. Upon completion of the 5 sessions, HHS staff provides a detailed report with recommendations and families are able to continue treatment on a sliding scale.

Developing partnerships with local community resources is an essential part of establishing a resource system for residents. On August 26, 2022, Dr. Monica Saavedra attended a meeting with representatives from Oak Street Health Center which provides medical services and programming to older adults.

During the meeting, Dr. Saavedra presented on HHS services and received a tour of the center and information on services and discussed ways to partner in the future.

Health and Human Services offers expired medication and sharps recycling on the first Wednesday of each month. In addition to the collection on the first of the month, Health and Human Services attended the Village's Annual Recycling Event held at Public Works on August 27, 2022. Dr. Audra Marks attended the Recycling Event where HHS collected 200 pounds of expired medication and used sharps from residents. During the month of August, Health and Human Services collected an additional 18 pounds of medication and 64 pounds of sharps.

Emergency Assistance

HHS continues to be a volunteer service extension site for the Salvation Army program. Through this program, HHS provides Salvation Army Emergency Assistance services to Hoffman Estates' residents in need. This fund provides limited financial support to families who show a need due to an unexpected emergency (i.e. insufficient funds for rent or past due utility bill). Staff meets with each client for approximately 45 minutes to assess the need for additional services and/or referrals. During the month of August, 3 residents were assisted through the Salvation Army program.

HHS is a designated site for individuals to apply for the Nicor Gas Sharing program. The program provides payment assistance with gas bills for those who qualify and meet income requirements. During the month of August, 1 resident was assisted.

The Lending Closet program provides residents with medical equipment on loan. Equipment includes wheelchairs, walkers, canes, crutches and knee scooters. These items are now available on loan for a small fee. During the month of August, 5 pieces of equipment were loaned to residents.

- Dr. Monica Saavedra attended the monthly meeting for the Senior Commission on August 9, 2022.

- Dr. Monica Saavedra discussed HHS services with General Government Intern Daniel Langguth and Deputy Village Manager Dan O'Malley on July 27, 2022.
- Dr. Audra Marks and Judy Aldana prepared for new student trainee orientation during the final weeks of August.
- Cathy Dagian, Gina McCauley, Dr. Audra Marks and Dr. Monica Saavedra continued planning for the upcoming Benefits of Wellness event in October and the Employee Walking Challenge which will be held in October.

The Village of Hoffman Estates Emergency Management status report for August, 2022:

Progress:

This past month's focus was on special event planning for the National Night Out event and planning efforts for the Platzkonzert festival in September.

EMC:

The month of August required a lot of attention on severe weather preparedness and special event operations. Special event planning this month included planning meetings and Event Action Plan (EAP) development for the 2022 Platzkonzert event. The process of EAP development requires frequent collaboration and communication among public safety personnel. I also coordinated multiple resources from Cook County to be used by the village.

I submitted the 2023 Emergency Management Performance Grant application for the village this month that will help supplement our village's emergency management efforts. This grant is a benefit to our village as being an accredited jurisdiction through IEMA.

EMA Team:

The Emergency Management Team participated in the Police Department's National Night Out special event. We provided the public with emergency preparedness information on severe weather, how to make a disaster kit and popsicles. This month, I created a Severe Weather Awareness power point to be shared to local faith institutions within the village that explains where to get weather information, how to receive warnings and what to do when the sirens are sounded for severe weather. I have assigned a member of the EMA Team to be a Faith Community Liaison that will conduct outreach to all of our religious institutions and assist in sharing this type of public education if requested.

Outlook:

I will begin EMA Team recruitment this fall to be able to expand out volunteer base. Volunteer recruitment advertisement will be disseminated through our village social media and through the Emergency Management webpage.

Due to a hold up at the manufacturer, the installation timeline for Outdoor Warning Siren #10, located at 4785 Higgins Rd projected to be late October- early November.


