1. CALL TO ORDER

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm by Chairperson Christian. A majority quorum of the commission was present at this time.

2. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES** – February 7, 2023

3. STAFF LIAISON REPORT

Mr. Howe reported that the Build a Birdhouse event will not be happening until next year. The commission discussed the role of subcommittees in providing recommended action on agenda items to the Commission for a vote.

4. NEW BUSINESS

a. Jeff Weiss, Flint Creek/Spring Creek Watersheds Partnership Presentation

Mr. Weiss provided the Commission with information on the Spring Creek watershed, including water quality, flooding, stewardship and conservation efforts, and opportunities to connect the Sustainability Commission with the Watershed Partnership.

b. Earth Day (April) - Park District Partnership

Co-chair Christian contacted Matt Schiller regarding Earth Day events with the Park District. Mr. Schiller informed her that there will be a volunteer event on Earth day and also a seed bombing event in the spring and will share more details when they are available.

c. Pollinator Month (June) - BioBlitz w/Illinois Monarch Project and Park District

Co-chair Lichtenbert presented the idea of hosting a Hoffman Estates BioBlitz with the Park District and the Illinois Monarch Project. She will provide more information for our meeting in April

e. Speaker Possibilities

Co-chair Lichtenbert reported that she could contact a person to present on regenerative agriculture from Climate Reality Project for the Hoffman Estates community. Mr. Howe also has a contact through Green Grease who could come to speak to the Commission about food grease recycling.

a. Green Business Program Refresh/Promotion

Mr. Howe reconfirmed to hold the 2 interviews with the interested businesses and hopes to schedule those interviews soon.

b. Sustainability Commission Website Improvements

c. Village Entryway Sign Landscaping Review

Commissioner Mulford mentioned that large bulk items should be considered as non-sustainable before submitting the list of suggestions. Co-chair Lichtenbert asked Commissioners to contact her about suggestions or updates to the list so they can be presented at next month's meeting.

Commissioner Mulford suggested "Pollinators and Native Wildflowers" to be the next topic for the Commission in May/June. Further topics will be discussed at a future meeting.

f. Right-of-way Restoration Materials

g. Mayor's Monarch Pledge

Mr. Howe reported that the Village is working on the Proclamation and will then move on to the next steps to fulfill the pledge. The reading of the proclamation will occur at the butterfly garden at 630 Illinois Boulevard on July 13th from 3-4pm.

Co-chair Lichtenbert shared an infographic that may be submitted to the Citizen newsletter.

6. OTHER

Commissioner Mulford commented that ComEd is working in Hoffman Estates and is hearing from residents that they would like to plant pollinator friendly plantings into the parkways. Mr. Howe reported that residents technically need permission from the Village to do any plantings on the parkways. Commissioner Bosher shared that he will be hosting a cleanup event on Earth Day (April22) with Jeff Weiss and the FC/SC watershed.
