PURPOSE: Update on the *Hoffman in Motion* Transportation Plan.

BACKGROUND: In January 2023, the Village entered into an agreement with IDOT

approving Statewide Planning and Research (SPR) program funding for the Village's Comprehensive Multimodal Transportation Plan. The goal of this effort is to update the Village's 2010 Comprehensive Bicycle Plan and create a multimodal focused plan for all modes of travel (biking, walking, and transit), identify priority projects and funding sources, and establish a framework for

a new GIS-based asset management system.

In December 2023, the Village entered a contract with Epstein and their subcontractors, HNTB and All Together to produce the plan and associated asset management system. All Together is leading the branding, communications, and public engagement portion of the project, and have created the Hoffman in Motion brand, including graphics, color scheme, and associated project website at

www.hoffmaninmotion.com.

DISCUSSION: The purpose of this presentation is to introduce the Committee to key members of the project team, provide an overview of the upcoming project milestones and community engagement strategy, as well as provide physical materials that Board members can use to spread the word and answer questions from residents and interested

parties about the project.

The first phase of public engagement will include the following components:

➤ Online engagement through hoffmaninmotion.com/engage, including an interactive mapping tool and online survey launching on April 15.

- ➤ Pop-up events over the summer months to spread the word and get community feedback, including Summer Sounds on the Green (June 20), a Senior Commission luncheon (May 15), and various Park District events.
- Focus groups with partner agencies, neighboring communities, and Village Commissions including the Youth Commission (April 25) and Commission for People with Disabilities (May 3).
- A community bike ride in May/June with partners from local bike shop Crank Revolution.
- A community workshop in July (specific date to be determined) that will offer opportunities for further feedback, engaging activities for community members to take part in, and a partnership with the Health and Human Services Department as they undertake efforts to engage residents around topics of mental health.
- ➤ A project Steering Committee consisting of residents and representatives of the Hoffman Estates business community will provide continuous input and direction throughout the process.

Information gathered from members of the public will be used to inform the recommendations of the plan, including physical infrastructure recommendations (such as where to add bike paths to link important routes) and policy recommendations.

Project completion is anticipated in summer 2025.

This plan, branded "Hoffman in Motion," is a plan that aims to integrate various forms of transportation, such as walking, bicycling, public transit, and rolling, to create a cohesive, efficient, and accessible mobility system.

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTED OUTCOMES?



POLICY & PROGRAMMING RECOMMENDATIONS

The plan will propose new policies and programs aimed at enhancing safety, accessibility, and connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists, establishing an environment that encourages walking and biking while addressing existing barriers, and promoting cycling and walking through education, community engagement, and incentives.



INFRASTRUCTURE RECOMMENDATIONS

The plan will outline specific infrastructure improvements, such as expanding bike lanes/paths, enhancing pedestrian crossings, and implementing more safety infrastructure, to make walking and biking safer and more enjoyable. The plan will also outline cost estimates and future funding.



DATA & UPDATED PROCESSES

The project team will leverage data collected from various sources to identify high-priority areas for improvement and to measure the success of implemented strategies. The project team will suggest new structures and processes for the Village, focusing particularly on enhancing asset management.





TIMELINE

Data Analysis & Stakeholder Engagement

March - May 2024

Collects transportation data and engages with key stakeholders to identify challenges and opportunities.

Public Engagement (Phase II)

August - October 2024
Seeks feedback on the Draft Plan from the community to refine and adjust proposals.

Public Engagement (Phase III)

December 2024 - March 2025
Final opportunity for public input, focusing on fine-tuning and confirming the plan's direction.



Public Engagement (Phase I)

April - July 2024
Gathers community input on transportation preferences and concerns through surveys and meetings.

Draft Plan

October 2024

Develops a preliminary version of the plan incorporating data analysis and initial public feedback.

Final Plan & Approval

April 2025
Finalizes the plan incorporating all feedback for presentation and approval by the relevant authorities.







GENERAL UPDATES

- ♦ An update of the *Hoffman In Motion* Transportation Plan to be provided at the April 8 TRI Committee. Ongoing plan updates can be found in the Planning Monthly Report.
- Phase I feasibility study of the Hassell Road Ped/Bike Enhancement Project is nearing completion after IDOT review of the Project Development Report. A required public information meeting was held on Thursday, April 4 at Village Hall. Notice of the meeting was published in the Daily Herald, as well as on the Village Website, E-News, and social media channels. The request for proposals for Phase II engineering design is expected to be released in the coming months.

TRANSIT UPDATES

Northwest Cook County Transit Plan

CMAP selected SRF, Sam Schwartz, and Metro Strategies to complete this plan which will provide recommendations for more effective, efficient, coordinated transit services among and across the Hoffman Estates and Schaumburg area. Participating communities and organizations include the Villages of Hoffman Estates and Schaumburg, Townships of Hanover, Palatine and Schaumburg, Pace Suburban Bus, and Harper Community College. Coordination meetings are ongoing, with public engagement scheduled to begin shortly.

Taxi Discount Program

Program registration is ongoing with identification cards and coupons sent to residents. Since its inception, 822 residents have registered for the program, with 347 current eligible registrants. The graph below shows historical, year-to-date use, and an estimate of the 2024 usage. The most recent coupons turned in covered through mid-February.
