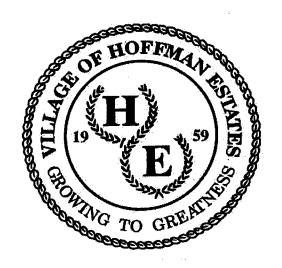

## AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF PERSONAL PROPERTY OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF HOFFMAN ESTATES

## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE VILLAGE OF HOFFMAN ESTATES AND THE O'HARE NOISE COMPATIBILITY COMMISSION

WHEREAS, pursuant to authority granted by an ordinance adopted by the Chicago City Council on October 30, 1996, and Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution and the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act (5 ILCS 220), the City entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement Relating to the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission (the "Intergovernmental Agreement") by and among the City and various municipalities and public school districts (as defined in the Intergovernmental Agreement, "Participants"); and

WHEREAS, the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission ("ONCC") was established pursuant to the Intergovernmental Agreement and provides a common forum for interested parties to have a voice in noise issues related to the Airport; and

WHEREAS, by its terms, the Intergovernmental Agreement became effective in November of 1996 and the term was extended from December 31, 2005 to December 31, 2010, and again the term was extended to December 31, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Hoffman Estates is currently a member of the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission; and

WHEREAS, ONCC has indicated a desire to approve the amended Intergovernmental Agreement; and

WHEREAS, on January 13, 2011, the Chicago City Council considered a revised Intergovernmental Agreement adding terms to allow for representatives of five (5) wards to serve on the ONCC; and

WHEREAS, THE City of Chicago approved the revised Intergovernmental Agreement which is attached to this Resolution as Exhibit "A".

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hoffman Estates, Cook and Kane Counties, Illinois, as follows:

At the December 13, 2010, Village Board meeting, the request by Great Clips for a Zoning Code text amendment regarding temporary signs was deferred until the second meeting in June 2011. The owner of Great Clips (two locations in Hoffman Estates) was requesting a change in the code that would permit businesses to install ground-mounted temporary special event signs on properties in the Village to periodically advertise special sales or events throughout the year. Presently, most temporary signs of this nature must be mounted on the building.

The Village Board deferred the Great Clips request because earlier that night the Planning, Building and Zoning Committee voted to suspend the enforcement of the temporary sign regulations for shopping centers under certain circumstances. By tabling the request, it allowed time to see if the rule suspension would meet the needs of Great Clips and other businesses.

Staff recently contacted the Great Clips owner, Pratibha Jairath, and verified that the rule suspension has allowed Great Clips to accomplish their advertising goals during 2011, however, the suspension of rules expires at the end of 2011 and the business will still have a need for this advertising in future years.

There are several options available, including a further extension of the rule suspension, further consideration of a zoning code text amendment, revert back to enforcing the current code, and possibly other options. To allow time for these choices to be analyzed, it is suggested that the request be deferred to the August Planning, Building and Zoning Committee meeting.

Attached is a summary of the December 2010 approval for suspension of Temporary Sign Regulations.

## RECOMMEDATION

It is recommended that this item be remanded to the August Planning, Building and Zoning Committee meeting for further discussion.

## Temporary Business Signage Assistance Program During Distressed Economy January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2011

The following items are in effect through December 31, 2011, to assist businesses:

- 1. <u>Temporary Banner Signs</u>. Temporary special event banner signs permitted by Section 9-3-8-K-5-c-(2) and 9-3-8-K-5-d-(1) of the Zoning Code shall be permitted to be displayed for a maximum of six times per calendar year, versus the typical three times permitted by the Zoning Code. Further, up to two banners at a time may be displayed, provided they were mounted on different building facades. Businesses can obtain consecutive permits and, therefore, they could also use the additional frequency to extend the timeframe allowed for a particular banner. This provision would be administered as part of the standard banner permit process.
- 2. <u>Temporary Signs in a Distressed Economy</u>. In addition to the signs permitted for businesses in Section 9-3-8-K-5 of the Zoning Code, additional temporary ground or wall signs may be permitted for businesses located in an extraordinarily distressed situation related to surrounding vacancies (buildings or land) or other economic hardship. Signs would be permitted to provide greater visibility of existing businesses or tenants when they are located within a commercial subdivision or shopping center. Procedurally, the Village Manager will be authorized to approve such signs after review of all relevant information. The following specific criteria would apply:
  - ♦ Each individual sign shall be no larger than 100 square feet for standalone buildings or out-lots, and no larger than 32 square feet for multi-tenant buildings or shopping centers.
  - The size and number of signs permitted shall be based on the amount of (public or private) street frontage.
  - ♦ The location, design, and size of the signs shall be reviewed by the Village, and no two signs shall be located closer than 250 feet to each other.
  - The business owner shall provide written documentation that the owner of the property will permit the sign and shall provide full contact information for the party responsible for the ongoing maintenance and removal of the sign.
  - For commercial subdivisions, signs advertising any business within the subdivision may be permitted on any lot within the same subdivision.
  - In general, the signs shall be used to provide more prominent visibility, to provide directional information and guidance, to advertise special events, or for other purposes intended to assist businesses overcome the distressed economic conditions.
  - For shopping centers or multi-tenant properties, any signage requests shall be coordinated with the property owner and other tenants. No more than one ground sign per street frontage shall be permitted on the property at any time, with the intention that the sign would be shared or alternated among the tenants and not used exclusively by an individual tenant. The Village will issue written approval to the property owner to install the sign, and coordination of the shared use of the sign by the tenants would be the responsibility of the property owner or the collective cooperation among the tenants.

## Temporary Business Signage Assistance Program During Distressed Economy January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2011

- 3. <u>Window Signs</u>. The Village will temporarily suspend the enforcement of the window sign coverage regulations. Window signage does not require a permit, and the Zoning Code allows up to 50% of the windows to be covered with signage and up to 10% of the windows to be used for illuminated signs. These window sign rules would be suspended and the following special provisions allowed.
  - ♦ A temporary suspension of window sign coverage rules, with the exception of prohibitions on flashing signs or the provision for electronic message boards.
  - A property owner of a shopping center or other vacant storefront may submit a proposal to use the windows of the vacant space(s) to display artwork, graphics or decorative signage, which do not include single advertising signs for specific individual tenants. The owner may propose signage that generically promotes the shopping center as a whole, such as "Shop Town Center for the Holidays" or artwork that includes a collection of logos or images representing all tenants as part of a cohesive signage presentation. Window box displays of merchandise may also be proposed as long as a consistent design and opportunity is presented for all/most tenants in a center.
  - Signs or graphics must be professionally made and generally improve the appearance of the storefront rather than detracting from the appearance.
  - A review by staff is required prior to installation of any signage in vacant storefront windows. This would be primarily to avoid poorly designed signs or unsightly signs (e.g. a series of window panes spelling out a word with each window including one oversized letter). Per the Zoning Code, no such review is required for window signs in existing businesses; this staff review only applies to vacant storefronts.

For all above provisions, signs specifically prohibited by the Zoning Code (such as moving, flashing, rotating signs, etc.) shall be prohibited and all other relevant sections of the code shall still apply (for example, signs cannot be located within a public right of way or blocking visibility for drivers at an intersection).

## Temporary Business Signage Assistance Program During Distressed Economy January 1, 2011 - December 31, 2011

- 3. <u>Window Signs</u>. The Village will temporarily suspend the enforcement of the window sign coverage regulations. Window signage does not require a permit, and the Zoning Code allows up to 50% of the windows to be covered with signage and up to 10% of the windows to be used for illuminated signs. These window sign rules would be suspended and the following special provisions allowed.
  - A temporary suspension of window sign coverage rules, with the exception of prohibitions on flashing signs or the provision for electronic message boards.
  - A property owner of a shopping center or other vacant storefront may submit a proposal to use the windows of the vacant space(s) to display artwork, graphics or decorative signage, which do not include single advertising signs for specific individual tenants. The owner may propose signage that generically promotes the shopping center as a whole, such as "Shop Town Center for the Holidays" or artwork that includes a collection of logos or images representing all tenants as part of a cohesive signage presentation. Window box displays of merchandise may also be proposed as long as a consistent design and opportunity is presented for all/most tenants in a center.
  - ♦ Signs or graphics must be professionally made and generally improve the appearance of the storefront rather than detracting from the appearance.
  - A review by staff is required prior to installation of any signage in vacant storefront windows. This would be primarily to avoid poorly designed signs or unsightly signs (e.g. a series of window panes spelling out a word with each window including one oversized letter). Per the Zoning Code, no such review is required for window signs in existing businesses; this staff review only applies to vacant storefronts.

For all above provisions, signs specifically prohibited by the Zoning Code (such as moving, flashing, rotating signs, etc.) shall be prohibited and all other relevant sections of the code shall still apply (for example, signs cannot be located within a public right of way or blocking visibility for drivers at an intersection).

## **FINDING**

Section 9-1-17 of the Zoning Code – *Standards for a Text Amendment* - states that the Planning and Zoning Commission (PZC) shall not recommend the adoption of a proposed amendment unless it finds that the adoption of such amendment is in the public interest and is not solely for the interest of the petitioner.

The Commission discussed the proposal and verified that the amendment will only affect the price display portion of gas station ground signs – it will not change any of the other existing regulations for these signs. There was some discussion about the potential brightness of electronic signs and proximity to residential properties, however it was decided that the current code already has rules requiring sign illumination to be turned off at night when a house is nearby.

Planning and Zoning Commission Finding of Fact Text Amendment - Automobile Service Station Signs Village Board Meeting Date: June 27, 2011

It was noted that there are several service stations in the Village that would benefit from this code change and that this section of the Zoning Code was written at a time when this type of technology was not commonly used for price display. It is appropriate to periodically update the code to address changes in technology. The Commission determined that this text amendment is in the public interest and it is not solely for the interest of the petitioner.

## 1. REQUESTED ACTION

Request by Charter National Bank & Trust (Property Owner) and EVT, Inc. (Business Operator) for approval of Text Amendment to the Zoning Code to permit electronic message signs to be used to display fuel prices on a freestanding or ground sign at a service station, based on the revised text as follows: (<u>Underlined</u> text is new, Strikethrough-text is deleted)

Section 9-3-8-M-10-c Automobile Service Station Signs in the Business District

(4) One freestanding or ground sign not to exceed 20 feet in height. Such sign shall not exceed 100 square feet in surface area for a single face sign or 200 square feet in surface area for a multiface sign, shall relate to the name and/or use of the facility or premises, and may be illuminated, and may include an area for the electronic display of fuel prices. Such sign shall be set back a minimum of ten feet from any property line, and five feet from any interior roadway or pedestrian walkway.

## 2. PROPOSAL

Automobile service stations are required by State law to display fuel prices on the property. Fuel prices fluctuate on a regular basis and with each change an employee must manually change the numbers on the sign. The petitioner has indicated that in many cases the numbers are several feet above the ground so that a pole or ladder must be used. The petitioner has stated that this is a safety and liability concern for the owners and that it also can lead to property maintenance issues if the numbers are damaged due to frequent use. Changes are also more difficult in inclement weather.

Modern technology now exists for an electronic or digital display to be used as part of a ground or freestanding sign. By using an electronic message component on the ground or freestanding sign, fuel price changes can be accomplished remotely and instantly from within the building. The Petitioner feels this option will allow his and other service stations to be updated and remain competitive with other area service stations.

## 3. TEXT AMENDMENT STANDARDS

Section 9-1-17 of the Zoning Code – *Standards for a Text Amendment* - states that the Planning and Zoning Commission shall not recommend the adoption of a proposed amendment unless it finds that the adoption of such amendment is in the public interest and is not solely for the interest of the petitioner.

Text amendments to the Zoning Code involve changes to the regulations that apply to all properties in the Village. The petitioner in this case owns one service station in the Village. If this request is approved, it will apply to all automobile service stations located in the Village.

## 4. STAFF SUMMARY

The issue of allowing electronic or digital signage to be used to display fuel prices at a service station is not limited to any one specific service station in the Village. It is appropriate to consider this request as a text amendment to provide all service stations an equal opportunity to take advantage of advancements in technology. In the past, several service station owners have inquired about the use of electronic signs, but after determining the Village Sign Code does not allow them, no business owner has ever chosen to pursue a formal code change. In one recent case, the developer of a new automobile service station at the corner of Barrington Road and Hassell Road was granted approval to use this type of sign through an overall Master Sign Plan for his retail development (construction expected later this year). In this case since a text amendment would allow this sign type to be used by all other automobile stations throughout the Village. A text amendment is ultimately a better solution than a master sign plan for this specific property.

The use of electronic signs to display fuel prices is becoming more common at many automobile service stations outside of the Village. At the time the Village's zoning code was adopted, this type of electronic technology was not being used to display fuel prices and therefore the code language did not make provisions for this. In this case, the zoning code text has become outdated due to technology and industry changes. These types of text amendments are appropriate periodically to update the Village's code.

The proposed text amendment would be limited to the display of fuel prices and would <u>not</u> permit electronic message boards with changing messages or advertisements. Zoning Code Section 9-3-8-C-22, which specifically prohibits electronic message signs, would not be changed with this request.

Staff has gathered a few sign examples for this hearing.

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 3, ALCOHOLIC LIQUORS, OF THE HOFFMAN ESTATES MUNICIPAL CODE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hoffman Estates, Cook and Kane Counties, Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: That sub-section C of Section 8-3-1, <u>DEFINITIONS</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### Section 8-2-1. DEFINITIONS

C. Applicant shall mean an individual, ee-partnership, or limited liability company, which seeks to be licensed under the provisions of this Code. In the case of a club, applicant shall mean the officers, directors and person operating as manager, and in. In the case of a corporation, it shall mean the officers, directors, all persons owning directly or beneficially more than five percent (5%) of the stock of such corporation and the person operating as manager of the premises. In the case of a limited liability company, it shall mean the members and managers of the limited liability company, as well as the person operating as manager of the premises.

<u>Section 2</u>: That Section 8-3-4, <u>APPLICATION</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Section 8-3-4. APPLICATION

Applications for such licenses shall be made to the Commission in writing, signed by the applicant, if an individual, or by a duly authorized agent thereof, if a club, corporation, or limited liability company verified by oath or affidavit, and shall contain the following statements and information:

A. The name, age and address of the applicant in the case of an individual; in the case of a ee-partnership, the persons or entities entitled to share in the profits thereof; and in the case of a corporation, the date of incorporation, the objects for which it was organized, a summary of its activities during the past year, and the names and addresses of the officers, directors, all persons owning directly or beneficially more than five percent (5%) of the stock of such corporation and the person operating as manager of the premises; and in the case of a limited liability company, the date of organization, the objects for which it was organized, a summary of its activities during the past year, and the names and addresses of the members and managers and the person operating as manager of the premises; and in the case of a club, the date of its incorporation, the objects for which it was organized, a summary of its activities during the past year, the names and addresses of the officers, directors, and the person operating as manager. A club must file with the Local Liquor Control

Commission at the time of its application for a license under this Code two (2) copies of a list of names and residences of its members, and similarly file with ten (10) days of the election of any additional member, his name and address.

- B. The citizenship of the applicant, the place of his birth, and if a naturalized citizen, the time and place of his naturalization.
- C. The character of business of the applicant; and in case of a corporation or limited liability company, the objectives for which it was formed.
- D. The length of time said applicant has been in business of that character, or in the case of a corporation or limited liability company, the date when its charter was issued.
- E. The amount of goods, wares and merchandise on hand at the time application is made.
- F. The location and description of the premises or place of business which is to be operated under such license, including a description of signs advertising alcoholic beverages.
- G. A statement whether applicant has made application for a similar or other license on premises other than described in this application, and the disposition of such application.
- H. A statement that applicant is not disqualified to receive a license by reason of any matter or thing contained in this Article, laws of this State, or the Ordinances of the Village, and a statement as to whether applicant has ever been convicted of a felony.
- I. Whether a previous license by any state or subdivision thereof, or by the Federal Government has been revoked, and the reasons thereof.
- J. A statement that the applicant will not violate any of the laws of this State of Illinois, or of the United States, or any ordinances of the Village in the conduct of his place of business.

<u>Section 3</u>: That Section 8-3-5, <u>RESTRICTION ON LICENSES</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### Section 8-3-5. RESTRICTION ON LICENSES

No license shall be issued to:

- A. A person who is not a resident of the Village or does not reside within 20 miles of the Village.
- B. A person who is not a citizen of the United States;
- C. A person who has been convicted of a felony under any Federal or State law if the Commission determines, after investigation, that such person has not been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust;
- D. A person who has been convicted of being the keeper of or keeping a house of prostitution;
- E. A person who has been convicted of pandering or other crime or misdemeanor opposed to public decency and morality;



- F. A person whose license under this Article has been revoked for cause;
- G. A person who at the time of application for renewal of any license issued hereunder would not be eligible for such license if he were not eligible under a prior application;
- H. A ee-partnership, unless all the members of such ee-partnership shall be qualified to obtain a license;
- I. A corporation or limited liability company, if any member, officer, manager or director thereof, or any stockholder or stockholders owning directly or beneficially in the aggregate more than five percent of the stock of such corporation, would not be eligible to receive a license hereunder for any reason other than citizenship and residence within the Village or within 20 miles of the Village;
- J. A corporation or limited liability company unless it is incorporated or organized in Illinois, or unless it is a foreign corporation or foreign limited liability company which is qualified under the Business Corporation Act or the Limited Liability Company Act to transact business in Illinois;
- K. A person whose place of business is conducted by a manager or agent unless said manager or agent possesses the same qualifications required of the licensee;
- L. A person who has been convicted of a violation of any Federal or State law concerning the manufacture, possession or sale of alcoholic liquor, who shall have forfeited his bond to appear in court to answer charges for any such violation;
- M. A person who does not own the premises for which a license is sought, or does not have a lease thereon for the full period for which the license is issued;
- N. Any elected public official, Village of Hoffman Estates employee, or member of any Hoffman Estates Board or Commission, and no such official shall be interested in any way, either directly or indirectly;
- O. Any applicant who fails to obtain a State liquor license shall not be able to operate in the Village;
- P. A person who is not a beneficial owner of the business to be operated by the licensee;
- Q. A person who has been convicted of a gambling offense as proscribed by any of the sections or subsections of Chapter 7, Article 7 (Gambling and Related Offenses) of the Municipal Code of the Village of Hoffman Estates;
- R. A person to whom a Federal gaming device stamp or a Federal wagering stamp has been issued by the Federal Government for the current tax period;
- S. A eo-partnership to which a Federal Gaming device stamp or a Federal Wagering stamp has been issued by the Federal Government for the current tax period, or if any of the partners have been issued a Federal wagering stamp by the Federal Government for the current tax period;

- T. A corporation or limited liability company, if any member, officer, manager or director thereof, or any stockholder owning in the aggregate more than five percent of the stock of such corporation has been issued a Federal gaming stamp or a Federal wagering stamp for the current tax period;
- U. Any premises for which a Federal gaming device stamp or a Federal wagering stamp has been issued by the Federal Government for the current tax period;
- V. A club which in its membership policies and practices or in its service to guests, discriminates on the basis of race, religion, national origin or sex;
- W. A corporation **or limited liability company**, unless the designated person operating as manager of the premises as required by Section8-3-4 is a resident of the Village or resides within 20 miles of the Village.

<u>Section 4</u>: That Section 8-3-9, <u>CHANGE IN PERSONNEL</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

### Section 8-3-9. CHANGE IN PERSONNEL

- A. Any changes in partnership, members, managers, officers, directors, persons holding directly or beneficially more than five percent of the stock or ownership interest or managers of establishments licensed under this Code, shall be reported n writing to the Commission within ten days of the change. All new personnel shall meet all the standards of this Code and must otherwise qualify to hold a liquor license. All such changes in personnel shall be subject to review by the Commission.
- B. When a license has been issued to a partnership and a change of ownership occurs resulting in a partnership interest by one who is not eligible to hold a liquor license, said license shall terminate.
- C. When a license has been issued to a corporate corporation and a change takes place in manager, officers, or directors, or shareholders of more than five percent (5%) of the stock, or managers-resulting in the holding of office or the holding of such shares of stock by one who is not eligible for a license, said license shall terminate.
- D. When a license has been issued to an individual who is no longer eligible for a license, said license shall terminate.
- E. When a license has been issued to a limited liability company and a change takes place in members or managers or there is a change in the manager of the premises, resulting in the holding of office by one who is not eligible for a license, said license shall terminate.

<u>Section 5</u>: That sub-section I of Section 8-3-21, <u>LICENSE CLASSIFICATION</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Section 8-3-21. LICENSE CLASSIFICATION

I. Class "G". A class "G" license shall authorize the sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises of any arena seating of 5,000 or more in a disposable container only. No other alcoholic beverage(s) shall be permitted on the premises and the

licensee shall take reasonable measures to assure compliance. In addition, the holder of a class "G" license shall be authorized to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on surrounding Village owned property subject to a separate agreement with the Village. The annual fee for such license shall be \$6,000.

<u>Section 6</u>: That sub-section B of Section 8-3-23, <u>LOCATION RESTRICTIONS</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Section 8-3-23. LOCATION RESTRICTIONS

B. When an application for license is received by the Liquor Commission for a location not presently the address of a holder of a liquor license, the Commission shall cause a notice that application has been made for such license stating the name of the applicant, the residence address of the applicant, and the street number and location of the premises covered by said application. Said notice shall state the time and place of a hearing by the Liquor Commission and notify all persons that any objection to the granting of said license shall be made to the Liquor Commission, in writing, signed by the objector stating specifically the grounds of his objection or in person at the hearing. Such notice shall be mailed to all property owners within 200 feet of said location.

B. When an application for license is received by the Liquor Commission for a location not presently the address of a holder of a liquor license, the Commission shall cause a notice that application has been made for such license stating the name of the applicant and location of the premises covered by said application. Said notice shall state the time and place of a hearing by the Liquor Commission and notify all persons that any objection to the granting of said license shall be made to the Liquor Commission, in writing, signed by the objector stating specifically the grounds of his objection or in person at the hearing. Such notice shall be continuously posted on the premises covered by the application for at least seven (7) days prior to said hearing. The applicant shall present sworn written confirmation of the posting of the notice at said hearing.

<u>Section 7</u>: That Section 8-3-29, <u>PENALTY</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

## Sec. 8-3-29. PENALTY

Any person, firm, ex corporation or limited liability company violating any provisions of this Code shall be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense; and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which a violation occurs or continues.

In addition, any employee violating any provision of this Code shall be subject to suspension of certificate up to one year or revocation of certificate.

 $\underline{\text{Section 8}}$ : That the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to publish this ordinance in pamphlet form.

<u>Section 9</u>: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately from and after its passage and approval.

<u>Section 1</u>: That Section 8-2-1, <u>FEES</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be amended by adding thereto the following sub-category and fee:

Merchants (Products)

Garage Sales

No Fee (on site) \$20

<u>Section 2</u>: That Article 8-7, <u>MERCHANTS (PRODUCTS)</u> of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be amended by adding Section 8-7-19, <u>GARAGE SALES</u>, to read as follows:

### Section 8-7-19. GARAGE SALES

- A. Definitions For the purposes of this section, the following definitions shall apply unless the context clearly indicates or requires a different meaning.
  - 1. "Directional Sign" any sign offering directions to the sale premises and located other than on the sale premises.
  - 2. "Permit Sign" the Permit Sign issued by the Village of Hoffman Estates designating the locating and dates of the sale.
  - 3. "Garage Sale" the sale of goods, wares and merchandise commonly known as Garage Sales or yard sales conducted on an infrequent and unscheduled basis. The term "Garage Sale" includes all general sales to the open public, conducted from a residential premises, for the purpose of disposing personal property. Bulk sales, the sale of multiple new items of the same description and the sale of consigned merchandise, merchandise brought to the premises for resale or for reconditioning for resale are prohibited.
- B. Time Limitations It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct or allow the conducting of a Garage Sale as it is defined herein on premises zoned or used for residential purposes on any day except Thursday, Friday, Saturday, or Sunday, or to conduct more than three (3) such Garage Sales on the same premises, by the same household, within any twelve (12) month period of January 1 through December 31. Each Garage Sale may be up to three (3) consecutive days. It is further provided that no Garage Sale, as defined herein, shall begin before 9:00 a.m. nor continue later than 5:00 p.m., and a period of thirty (30) days must occur between Garage Sales at the same premises.
- C. Limitation on Display of Goods A person who is conducting a Garage Sale as defined herein may place on display any goods, wares, merchandise under the provisions of this chapter up to the front property line. Such displays may not extend beyond the property line or into the public right of way.

- D. Permit Required It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct or allow the conducting of a Garage Sale as defined herein on premises zoned or used for residential purposes without first obtaining a Village permit to conduct such a sale. The permit application for a Garage Sale shall be made in writing to the Development Services Department or online via the Village's website. If a sale is conducted without a permit, the Development Services Department may issue an "on site" permit for the fee set in Section 8-2-1 of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code at a cost of \$20.00. A permit may be issued to a homeowner's association and all listed addresses in the permit application would be permitted to conduct a Garage Sale under one (1) permit. The Garage Sale permit shall be issued in the form of a Village issued Garage Sale Permit Sign which must then be prominently displayed on a window facing the front lawn or on the front lawn of the premise covered by the permit in such a manner as to be visible to persons passing by the premises. The Garage Sale Permit Sign shall be prominently displayed during all operating hours of the sale.
- E. House Sign Limitations Only one (1) on-site Garage Sale sign shall be permitted on the front lawn of the property and not in the parkway or in public right-of-way, in addition to the Garage Sale Permit Sign. One (1) additional yard sign will be permitted in the side yard of those residences that are located on a corner lot. All other items which are intended to draw attention to the Garage Sale, including but not limited to banners, balloons, streamers, and the like are strictly prohibited.
- F. Directional Signs Two (2) directional signs for any one (1) Garage Sale shall be allowed, subject to the following restrictions:
  - 1. Each sign shall not exceed six (6) square feet in gross surface area per sign face.
  - 2. Each sign shall denote the address of the Garage Sale.
  - 3. Signs shall be elevated to height no greater than three (3) feet from the ground to the top of the sign.
  - 4. A sign shall not be placed in any manner to obstruct any line of vision for drivers of any vehicle.
  - 5. Only four (4) Garage Sale directional signs to the same address may be posted on one (1) tract of real estate and only with the permission of the property owner.
  - 6. At no time shall signs advertising Garage Sales be erected on any public right-of-way, street sign, utility pole, or traffic control device.
- G. Sign Placement and Removal All signs authorized under the provisions of this section shall not be placed before 6:00 a.m. on the first day of the Garage Sale and signs authorized under the provisions of the chapter are to be removed no later than three (3) hours after the conclusion of the sale, or by 8:00 p.m. at the latest.

Section 3: That any person, firm, or corporation violating any provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not less than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) and each separate day that an offense continues or exists shall be considered a separate offense hereunder.

### VILLAGE OF HOFFMAN ESTATES

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 13-4, HOTEL TAX, OF THE HOFFMAN ESTATES MUNICIPAL CODE

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Hoffman Estates, Cook and Kane Counties, Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>: That Article 4, <u>HOTEL TAX</u>, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code be amended to read as follows:

#### Article 4

#### HOTEL TAX

## Section 13-4-1. HOTEL TAX

A tax is hereby levied and imposed upon the use and privilege of renting, leasing or letting of rooms in a hotel as defined by Section 8-8-7 of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code in the Village of Hoffman Estates at a rate of six percent (6%) of the gross rental receipts from such rental, leasing or letting. The ultimate incidence of and liability for payment of said tax shall be borne by the user, lessee or tenant of said rooms. The tax herein levied shall be in addition to any and all other taxes.

## Section 13-4-2. PAYMENT AND COLLECTION

The owner and operator of each hotel and the person to whom the license to operate said hotel shall have been issued by the Village, shall bear jointly and severally, the duty to collect the tax from each user, lessee or tenant of rooms in such hotel or motel. Every person required to collect the tax levied by Article shall secure said tax from the user, lessee or tenant of a room or rooms at the time that he collects the price, charge or rent to which it applies.

## Section 13-4-3. ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT

The Finance Director hereby is designated as the Administration and Enforcement Officer of the tax hereby imposed on behalf of the Village. It shall be the responsibility and duty of the Finance Director to collect all amounts due the Village from the owners, operators and licensees of hotels in the Village of Hoffman Estates.

A sworn quarterly hotel and motel occupancy tax return shall be filed by each owner, operator or licensee of each hotel in the Village of Hoffman Estates with the Finance Director, on forms prescribed by him, showing all receipts from each renting, leasing or letter of rooms during the preceding quarter. The dates upon which said quarterly returns are to be filed shall be provided by rules and regulations promulgated by the Finance Director.

## Section 13-4-4. LATE PAYMENT PENALTY

If any tax imposed by this Article is not paid when due, a late payment penalty equal to two percent (2%) of the unpaid tax shall be added for each month, or any portion thereof, that such tax remains unpaid, and the total of such late payment penalty shall be paid along with the tax imposed by this Article.

## Section 13-4-5. ENFORCEMENTS

Payment and collection of the tax imposed by this Article and any late payment penalty may be enforced by an action in any court of competent jurisdiction. The failure to collect, account for, and pay over the tax imposed by this Article, including any late

payment penalty, shall be cause for suspension or revocation of any Village license issued pursuant to Chapter 8, Licenses, of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code.

## Section 13-4-6. PENALTY

- A. Any person failing or omitting to pay said tax when due or failing or omitting to collect, account for or pay over said tax, together with any late payment penalty, or failing to maintain or allow the examination of the required records shall, in addition to any other payment penalty or fee provided by law, be fined not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for each offense, and each day a violation continues shall be considered a separate and distinct violation.
- B. Any person failing or omitting to pay said tax when due or failing or omitting to collect, account for or pay over said tax, together with any late payment penalty, or failing to maintain or allow the examination of the required records shall, in addition to any other payment, penalty or fee provided by law be required to pay a hearing fee if a hearing is required under Section 8-1-14 of the Hoffman Estates Municipal Code to show cause why the business license should not be revoked. Such fee shall be \$100 for each hearing, but \$250 if it is the second such hearing in twelve (12) months and \$500 if it is the third or more such hearing in twelve (12) months. Such fee shall be required under any circumstance causing such hearing to be scheduled whether or not the person pays said tax or not subsequent to the notice of the hearing.

<u>Section 2</u>: That the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to publish this ordinance in pamphlet form.

Section 3: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and approval according to law.
