

Ages 0-5

Today's children are exposed to violence in their homes, schools, and community. Whether the violence is seen, heard, or experienced it impacts the health and sense of well-being of children and their families.

Children are exposed to violence in many ways:

- Child Physical Abuse
- Child Sexual Abuse
- Child Neglect
- Domestic Violence
- School Violence/Bullying
- Community Violence
- Media Violence

SIGNS YOUR CHILD MAY HAVE BEEN **EXPOSED TO VIOLENCE:**

- Nightmares or Changes in Sleeping Habits
- Changes in Eating Habits
- Fears or Anxiety
- Nervousness or Startles Easily
- Aggressive Behavior or Angry

Outbursts

- Distractibility
- Poor Attention Span
- Bedwetting or Regression
- Withdrawal from Friends or Favorite Activities

SAFE FROM THE START



in collaboration with community agencies, provides the following FREE services:

CENTRALIZED INTAKE

- Accepts referrals from family members or professionals
- · With caregiver's consent, professionals are identified and contacted

SPECIALIZED ASSESSMENT

- Developmentally appropriate (0-5)
- Culturally sensitive
- Assesses symptoms relative to exposure to violence

INTENSIVE CASE MANAGEMENT

- Weekly in person meetings with families
- · Occurs at agency, school, child's home, or other safe setting determined by caregiver and SFTS Family Case Coordinator

THERAPEUTIC SERVICES

Children exposed to violence experience symptoms which may interfere with their ability to learn, play, and feel safe. Caregivers may find it difficult to parent their child without support.

SFTS provides:

- * Crisis intervention
- * individual, group, and family therapy
- * play therapy
- * parent education groups and workshops

COMMUNITY EDUCATION AND VIOLENCE PREVENTION
