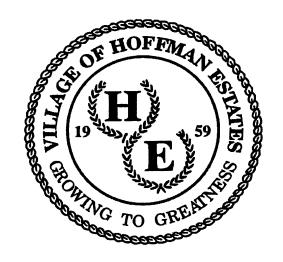

Planning and Zoning Commission Finding of Fact
Montessori School – 1250 Freeman Road – Special Use Amendment
Village Board Meeting Date: October 7, 2013

FINDING

The Commission heard from the petitioner, Molood Naghibzadeh (school owner). The request includes a Special Use Amendment to allow the 1250 Freeman Road property to be used as the main school, independently from the school at 1200 Freeman Road. The latter building may be closed in the coming months due to a dispute with the property owner (the school leases the building). The Commission determined that the 1250 Freeman Road property includes sufficient parking spaces and drive aisles for staff and visitor parking as well as the picking up / dropping off of children before and after school. The petitioner intends to use the Park District property to the west for play activities. No formal play area or gardening is included on the subject property with this request.

The petitioner indicated that the school construction at 1250 Freeman Road will be completed this fall and she is pursuing the purchase of the 1200 Freeman Road property, which would allay the immediate need for this Special Use Amendment. However, she also indicated that the allowance for either building to be used as a main school building would be beneficial to the school.

The Commission generally responded favorably to the Amendment and that the site would be capable of accommodating the school activities currently occurring at both properties. The Commission considered the standards for a special use as identified in Section 9-1-18-I of the Zoning Code and determined that the proposed changes to the property will comply with the standards.

The Commission voted unanimously to recommend approval of the request.

BACKGROUND

In 2012, the petitioner, Molood Naghibzadeh, was granted a special use to occupy the subject building at 1250 Freeman Road as an ancillary expansion of the school at 1200 Freeman Road (which was originally approved in 1993). In July of this year, the Village Board granted a special use amendment to permit the expansion and remodeling of the 1250 Freeman building including the addition of two second-floor classrooms as well as site improvements on the property. The construction is currently underway.

The school currently includes approximately 130 students that attend the two buildings on either side of Mumford Drive, and 22 part and full time staff members. The school operated for the last year with about 12 adolescent age students in the 1250 Freeman building and about 120 children ages 3 to 12 in the main school building at 1200 Freeman Road.

Since the approval in July, an issue has arisen regarding the lease terms of the 1200 Freeman building, and the petitioner is proposing to vacate the property. This would require relocating the school activities entirely into the 1250 Freeman property.

Meeting Date: September 18, 2013

PROPOSAL

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The petitioner is proposing to vacate the school at 1200 Freeman Road and to relocate the school into the building at 1250 Freeman Road. The building at 1250 Freeman Road would no longer be used as an ancillary expansion of the 1200 Freeman Road building, but as the principal location of the school. This change requires an amendment to the approved special use at 1250 Freeman Road. Related to this, a condition of approval was included with the July 2013 approval indicating that this school building is only permitted as an ancillary building to the main school at 1200 Freeman Road and that if the petitioner were to propose in the future to modify the operation of the buildings with the subject property not strictly as an ancillary building then the special use would need to be reevaluated by the Village.

Parking

The previously approved construction of required landscape islands and re-striping of parking spaces will result in the overall number of parking spaces reducing from 52 to 37. The school currently has more staff members than is required by the teacher-student ratios of the American Montessori Society. The petitioner has provided information (attached) regarding these ratios.

The petitioner has also provided car counts with the total number of cars parked at the 1200 Freeman Road property over six school days. The average number of cars for the six days between 8:15 AM and 3:45 PM varied between 17 and 24 cars, but the peak number of cars counted was 30. No cars were parked at the 1250 Freeman Road property during these times. Under the current proposal the staff and visitors would all park at the 1250 Freeman Road property.

Drop-off and pick-up of student is staggered over a period of about an hour in the morning and afternoon. A few additional cars are parked in the lot during these times.

The number of cars parked on the property for staff and visitors would be accommodated in the 37 available spaces, but at certain peak times the parking lot could be full.

The petitioner has submitted (on September 10) a concept plan for an alternate parking layout. However, this alternate layout is <u>not</u> included in this review and will require further staff review before it can be reviewed formally by the Village Board. At this time the parking lot construction will be based on the July 1, 2013 site plan amendment approval.

Outdoor Activities

The subject building will no longer be used only for adolescent-age children, but for children from ages 3 to 15. The school intends to use the Park District property west of the 1250 Freeman property for outdoor play activities. The fence that existed along the rear property line has been removed as approved previously with the July 1, 2013 site plan amendment. The rear drive aisle will be removed and replaced with landscaping under the approved site improvements; however, the grade at the rear property line drops sharply to the adjacent creek. Because of this, the petitioner has indicated that no outdoor play activities will occur behind the building, and this has been included as a condition of approval.

Meeting Date: September 18, 2013

The petitioner has indicated that gardening may occur on the property. As with the alternate parking lot layout the gardening is not included with this approval. Any formal gardening area would need to be designated on a site plan and reviewed as a site plan amendment.

SPECIAL USE - ZONING CODE SECTION 9-8-2-C-9

The special use review should consider any potential impact of the proposed relocation of the school entirely onto 1250 Freeman Road with daytime outdoor activities at the adjacent Park District property.

The subject property is zoned R-9 Subzone F-1, Business District. Nursery School or Day Care is listed as a Special Use in the R-9 Subzone F-1 District.

Section 9-1-18-I of the Zoning Code (Standards for a S pecial Use) states: "No special use shall be recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission unless said Planning and Zoning Commission shall find:

- 1. That the establishment, maintenance, or operation of the special use will not be detrimental to or endanger the public health, safety, morals, comfort, or general welfare;
- 2. That the special use will not be injurious to the use and enjoyment of other property in the immediate vicinity for the purposes already permitted, nor substantially diminish and impair property values within the neighborhood;
- 3. That the establishment of the special use will not impede the normal and orderly development and improvement of surrounding property for uses permitted in the district;
- That adequate utilities, access roads, drainage, and/or necessary facilities have been or are being provided;
- 5. That adequate measures have been or will be taken to provide ingress or egress so designed as to minimize traffic congestion in public streets; and
- That the special use shall in all other respects conform to the applicable regulations of the district in which it is located, except in each instance as such regulations may be modified by the Village Board pursuant to the recommendation of the Planning and Zoning Commission.

NOTIFICATION

Standard notification letters have been sent to surrounding properties within 300 feet and no comments have been received.

STAFF SUMMARY

Although the petitioner has indicated verbally that the relocation may not occur if an arrangement is reached with the property owner of 1200 Freeman Road, this special use review should be considered based on the scenario of the school moving entirely into 1250 Freeman Road.

The parking lot at 1250 Freeman Road will accommodate the number of cars on a typical school day, although at some peak times the lot could be full.

The applicable conditions from prior approvals have been included.

RECOMMENDED CONDITIONS

If the Planning & Zoning Commission finds that the standards for a special use have been met, staff recommends the following conditions:

- 1. Introduction

KSD, Inc. dba as Montessori School of North Hoffman and Lotus Montessori School currently has three campuses in Hoffman Estates. They are located at 1200 Freeman Rd., 1250 Freeman Rd. and 3805 Huntington Blvd. The School has grown from its modest beginning in 1989 of 8 students to nearing operational capacity in 2012. The School is accredited by the American Montessori Society and Advanced Ed/North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement. All campuses hold business licenses issued by the Village of Hoffman Estates.

The school has been located at the 1200 Freeman Rd. address since 1989 where it has continually maintained a lease with the Motlagh Corp. The school has reached a roadblock in its negotiations for lease extension or purchase at this time. The school has in good faith made both an offer to purchase the property and an offer to renew the lease. While the school fully intends to pursue acquiring this property, it is in a position where it needs to temporarily vacate the premises due to the expiration of the lease.

Development Proposal

The property at 1250 Freeman Rd. offered KSD, Inc. a unique opportunity to expand on its current space. The building is now being completely renovated and was to be used as an ancillary site to 1200 Freeman Rd. Due to the inability to negotiate a lease extension at 1200 Freeman Rd. that school population will have to be re-located. The school is proposing that the student population merge into the building at 1250. This would cause the least disruption to a program that has operated in this area for nearly 25 years. We foresee this to be only a temporary measure for the 2013-2014 academic year. The school is expecting to be granted a building permit for its new campus at 2160 Ela Rd. in the very near future. Financing is in place for that project. The timeline on that project is 10 months to completion. Ideally, the school would acquire the 1200 Freeman site, utilize the 1250 Freeman building as originally intended, and use the Ela Rd. campus to expand its program to more students.

The School proposes to continue to fully renovate the property according to Village Ordinance No. 4379-2013. The school is willing to make modifications deemed necessary to temporarily accommodate the student population of 1200 Freeman Rd. Student ages would range from 3-15 years. Staff to student ratios would be maintained. The current estimate of combined enrollment is 150-175. There are 22 part and full time staff members. Indoor space would be designated to include 7 classrooms and 2 offices. There is ample space to accommodate this without changes to the original plan.

The School's regular business hours are Monday through Friday from 7 A.M. until 6 P.M. Staggered drop off times of 7-8 AM, 8, 8:30, 9 and 1 PM and pick up times of 12 PM, 2, 3:30, 4, 5 and 6 ensure minimal traffic at any given time.

Parking spaces would be brought down to 31 spaces in order to provide additional landscaping and green space as requested by the Village. Parking spaces for staff and parent needs would be about 25 spaces.

The School was awarded recognition as a "Green Business" in 2011 and would preserve the integrity of the natural surroundings. The School intends to approach the Park District with its desire to enhance some of the Park District property bordering the school by creating an environmentally sensitive, nature inspired play space. Current outdoor areas are used only for gardening activities. No formal outdoor activities will take place without site plan approval. Children will use the adjacent park for outdoor activities. The school will transport children to a rented facility for purposes of gym classes. Prior to having a gymnasium, the school used Hoffman Estates Park District facilities for these classes.

Conclusion

The proposed use of the property is not expected to involve uses or activities that in any way would be detrimental to the community. As a long-standing member of the community, KSD, Inc. fully intends its renovation plans to enhance the community. It offers the area another choice of educational methods. The complete re-design and renovation of the property will convert what was once a vacant foreclosed property into an appealing school facility. The combination of student population into one building offers the least disruption to the program and the quality education it provides. It is the school's intention to continue to pursue acquiring the property at 1200 Freeman Rd. and maintain its place in the community.

Responses to Additional Questions for 1250 Freeman Road

- 1. There are 22 part and full time staff members. The American Montessori Society requires our ratios to be 1 adult to 15 children for ages 2.5-6 years old and 1 adult to 20 children for children 6-15 years old. Currently our four 2.5-6 year old classes have 11, 11, 15 and 17 children; our three elementary classes have 17, 18 and 29 children; and our one adolescent class has 12. Only the smallest class has no assistant and the largest class has two teachers and an assistant. On average our ratios at all levels are about 1 adult to 10 children. We are currently staffed to accommodate any additional children so it is unlikely that the number of staff would increase. Part time staff would be offered increased hours if needed.
- 2. Attached is a log of the number of cars parked in the parking lot at different times each day of the week. Also attached is a proposed site plan for the parking area which shows more than an adequate number of spaces. No cars were parked at 1250 Freeman on these days.
- 3. As indicated in our application, outdoor activities would only occur at the park with the exception of some gardening. No children will be allowed to play in the back of the building at any time.

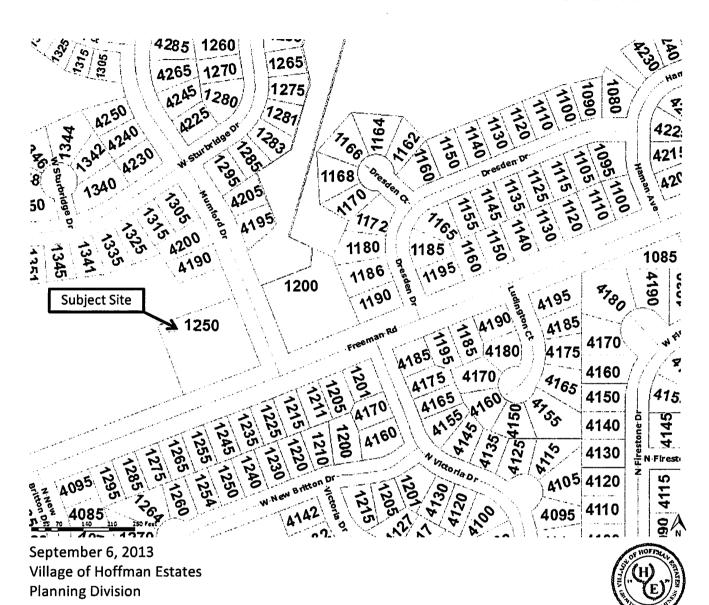

Although the Intergovernmental Agreement between the Village of Hoffman Estates and the Village of Streamwood for the joint Route 59 Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation construction project was approved by our Village Board on September 16, 2013 and had been approved by the Village of Streamwood, their legal counsel had several minor changes that were desired prior to the Village of Streamwood's approval of the Intergovernmental Agreement.

Our Village administration and Corporation Counsel have reviewed these changes and recommends that the revised Intergovernmental Agreement be approved by the Village Board. The revised Agreement is attached.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT FOR THE CONSTRUCTON OF THE 2013 CRITICAL SEWER REPAIRS FOR THE VILLAGE OF HOFFMAN ESTATES, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS AND THE VILLAGE OF STREAMWOOD, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS (ENGINEER'S JOB NO. 120035.40)

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by and between the Village of Hoffman Estates (hereinafter called "Hoffman Estates") and the Village of Streamwood (hereinafter called "Streamwood").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Streamwood and Hoffman Estates are home rule municipalities and pursuant to the Illinois Constitution, Article VII, Section 8, have certain powers which they are expressing; and

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Article VII of the Illinois Constitution and Intergovernmental Cooperation Act and 5 ILCS 220/1 et seq. allow and encourage intergovernmental cooperation; and

WHEREAS, a joint engineering and construction project for the construction of the 2013 Critical Sewer Repairs for the Village of Hoffman Estates, Illinois and the Village of Streamwood, Illinois as Engineer's Job No. 120035.40 (hereinafter called "Project") may be approached more effectively and economically with Streamwood and Hoffman Estates cooperating and using their joint efforts and resources.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the matters set forth, the mutual covenants and agreements contained in this agreement and other good and valuable consideration, Streamwood and Hoffman Estates hereby agree as follows:

- Hoffman Estates and Streamwood shall continue to abide by the joint Sanitary Sewer Agreement entered into by and between the Board of Village of Hoffman Estates and Board of Village of Streamwood on July 2, 1985 for Hoffman Estates' 18" sanitary Sewer and Streamwood's 36" sanitary sewer along Illinois Route 59.
- 2. Hoffman Estates shall have approximately 710 feet of the 18" ductile iron pipe and 3 manholes with approximately 61 vertical feet rehabilitated by lining through the process as specified in Engineer's Report No. 120035.40.
- 3. Streamwood shall have approximately 331 feet of the 36" reinforced concrete pipe and 2 manholes with approximately 44 vertical feet rehabilitated by lining through the process as specified in Engineer's Report No. 120035.40.

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- 4. A joint engineering and construction project shall be established that Streamwood and Hoffman Estates each contributes to 100% of their construction costs to be provided for work to be completed for each Village's phase as detailed in the Bid Form Schedule of Unit Prices, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" by the lowest responsible bidder as to be recommended by the Engineer and to be approved by Village Boards of both Streamwood and Hoffman Estates as their unilateral construction items in "Project". Streamwood and Hoffman Estates shall only be responsible for the actual costs of the work expended to complete its portion of the "Project." The current cost estimate for the combined construction work is approximately \$200,000\$281,876.
 - (a) Streamwood's total estimate of the work to be performed is \$156,900.00
 - (b) Hoffman Estate's total estimate of the work to be performed is \$124,976.00.
- The "Project" shall consist of a detailed engineering plan of the construction of the 2013 Critical Sewer Repairs in Hoffman Estates and in Streamwood as identified in Engineer's Report No. 120035.40, and construction of those critical sewer repairs as defined by both parties.
- 6. Hoffman Estates shall act as lead agency in securing the services of any outside consultants necessary to complete construction phase services. The cost of engineering construction phase services and construction shall be mutually agreed upon prior to any joint contract being entered. It is the intent of the parties that Streamwood and Hoffman Estates shall contribute substantial time of their staffs to prepare for a joint request for proposals for engineering services for the design and construction management of the project. Streamwood and Hoffman Estates shall not be reimbursed for any of their staffs' time in preparation of any of the work.
- 7. Hoffman Estates shall contribute 100% of the costs for all engineering work leading up to and including the joint bid documents and construction plans. Hoffman Estates and Streamwood shall each contribute 50% of the costs for all engineering work for the actual joint construction management. The current cost estimate for the combined engineering work is approximately \$20,000.
- 8. Should a joint construction item under a cost of \$2010,000 in the case of Streamwood and \$20,000 in the case of Hoffman Estates in addition to the above 2. and 3. is desired to be completed, the cost pro-ration shall be approved by both staffs of Hoffman Estates and Streamwood before the work order is executed. Should a joint construction item above a cost of \$2010,000 in the case of Streamwood and \$20,000 in the case of Hoffman Estates in addition to the above 2. and 3. is desired to be completed, the cost pro-ration shall be approved by Village Boards of both Hoffman Estates and Streamwood before the work order is executed.
- It is anticipated that the "Project" shall begin approximately on the date of October 7, 2013 and completed in December, 2013.

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- 10. At such time as construction is completed, inspected and approved by Hoffman Estates and Streamwood, Hoffman Estates shall pay for construction costs in accordance with Local Governmental Prompt Payment Act. Upon proof of payment by Hoffman Estates for construction costs, Streamwood shall reimburse Hoffman Estates in accordance with the Local Governmental Prompt Payment Act for Streamwood's portion of construction costs attributable to Streamwood's portion of the Project.
- 11. Performance Bonds as required shall name both Hoffman Estates and Streamwood as indemnified parties as to their respective portions of the Project.
- 12. Any and all policies of insurance as required by the Bid documents and/or Contract of Construction shall name both Hoffman Estates and Streamwood as additional insureds.
- 13. Hoffman Estates and Streamwood hereto mutually agree that the estimated local agency share cost of the Project is \$281,876 and agree to budget the necessary funds to pay for their respective portion or share of the Project. Each party acknowledges that the costs set forth in subsections (a) and (b) of Section 4 are estimates and may increase.
- 14. Hoffman Estates and Streamwood mutually agree with the Division of Costs as set forth herein.
- 15. Hoffman Estates and Streamwood agree that execution of this Agreement constitutes concurrence of the award of the construction contract to the responsible low bidder as determined by the State.
- 16. This Agreement shall be binding upon Hoffman Estates and Streamwood, their successors and assigns.
 - 4017. This Agreement shall become effective upon its execution by both Streamwood and Hoffman Estates and will remain in full force and effect until the Project is complete.
 - 44<u>18</u>. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the law and Constitution of the State of Illinois.
 - 1219. This Agreement consisting of three-four (43) pages may be executed in one or more counterparts.
 - 20. Hoffman Estates and Streamwood shall hold and save the other free and harmless from and due to the work or any liability arising from performance of the work on the Project by Contractor. Neither Hoffman Estates nor Streamwood shall be liable to the other for incomplete or defective work performed.
